







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Scope of The Public Accounts

The 1992–93 Public Accounts of the Government of Saskatchewan are organized into two reports:

Volume 1 contains the financial statements of the Consolidated Fund and the Summary Financial Statements which consolidate the financial activities of all organizations for which the Government of Saskatchewan is responsible. A schedule of summary information on superannuation, trust and special purpose funds for which the Government has administrative responsibility is also included.

Volume 2 contains details on the revenues and expenditures of the Consolidated Fund. Volume 2 also contains a listing of remissions of taxes and fees.

A **Compendium of Financial Statements**, is provided separately from the Public Accounts. This two-part report is comprised of the financial statements of various government boards, agencies, commissions, superannuation funds, special purpose funds and institutions, as well as Crown corporations which are accountable to the Treasury Board. Financial statements for Crown corporations that are accountable to the Crown Management Board appear in a separate compendium of annual reports compiled by the Crown Management Board.

Guide to Volume 2

Volume 2 reports details of revenue and expenditure by department for the Consolidated Fund. In addition, Volume 2 provides a listing of remissions of taxes and fees.

Information for the Consolidated Fund is organized and reported as follows:

- 1. Schedules of revenue by department and source, and revenue detail by department.
- Schedules comparing appropriations and expenditures by department as well as by program.
- 3. Details of expenditure by department. These details are organized as follows:

Department Mandates — A description of the mandates and major program areas of each department is provided.

Expenditure Summary — A matrix showing the amount spent for each program area (subvote). Expenditures are grouped into major categories described below:

Personal Services

Salaries, wages, honorariums and compensation paid to employees, as well as others who provided personal services.

Travel

Travel expenditures incurred by employees, Members of the Legislative Assembly, and others who provided personal services to the government.

Grants

Payments to local authorities and other third parties, as well as to or on behalf of individuals.

Contract Services

Expenditures for a wide variety of specialized professional services provided to departments.

Advertising

Expenditures for promotion of programs.

Supplies and Services

Expenditures for the acquisition of supplies and services used or required to carry out programs.

Equipment and Other Assets

Expenditures for the purchase of equipment and other assets used by departments in the delivery of government programs.

Other Payments

Expenditures which do not fit in any of the above categories.

Personal Services — A list of individuals (excluding unionized employees) who received \$2,500 or more for salaries, wages, honorariums and compensation for personal service.

Travel — A list of the amounts paid for Ministers' travel expenses.

Grant Payments — Listings, by program, of grant recipients who received \$5,000 or more. Very high volume programs of a universal nature are excluded.

Supplier Payments — A list of payees who received \$20,000 or more for the provision of goods and services.

Other Payments — Listing of payees, who received \$20,000 or more, for expenditures not included in other categories. Income security programs are excluded due to the confidential and personal nature of the information.

Additional information is reported for two departments:

- Highways A report on major maintenance and capital expenditures by highway.
- Legislation Schedules of payments to Members of the Legislative Assembly for serving on Committees and Boards as well as for their indemnities, allowances and expenses as members.

Other Information

Volume 2 lists individuals or companies that were granted remissions of taxes or fees. A remission is a return of or an exemption from liability to pay a tax, royalty, rental or fee payable to the Crown. Section 24 of *The Financial Administration Act, 1993* and also Section 42 of *The Revenue and Financial Services Act* provide that the Lieutenant Governor in Council may grant remissions where he/she considers it to be in the public interest or that great hardship or injustice to persons would otherwise occur. Both Acts permit the Minister of Finance to grant remissions where the amount is not greater than \$1,000.

Public Accounts, 1992-93

Agriculture and Food (Vote 1)

The Department's mandate is to provide leadership in developing and supporting competitive agriculture and food industries.

Administrative Services (Subvote 1)

Objective

To provide a strong administrative support system within the department to facilitate the delivery of services to our clients.

Program Administration

This program provides administrative support in the following areas: managing financial resources; processing expenditures and revenues; preparing forecasts and the budget; managing the department's facilities, transportation fleet and mail services; providing technical support on information technology; supporting the design and development of information systems; and managing all information going to Cabinet.

Human Resources (Subvote 4)

Obiective

To provide the Department and other departments with human resource expertise, support services, maintenance of records and information, and payroll services.

Program Administration

This program provides policy direction and guidance relating to benefits and Collective Agreement administration; complete staffing and classification services; coordination of staff development, in-house training, and personnel records management, including maintenance of the Personnel Attendance and Leave System, and the Human Resources Information System; and payroll service.

Communications (Subvote 3)

Objective

To provide information relating to the programs, policies, and services provided by the department to the public in an effective and efficient manner.

Program Administration

This program coordinates the following: production of all department pamphlets, brochures, letters, periodicals and other print material; all aspects of the A/V requirements within the department; films and A/V productions to promote techniques and practices in farm management and department programs; and information distribution through advertising, news releases, feature articles, and news conferences. It also gathers agriculture related information for research projects conducted by branches within the department.

Agricultural Engineering (Subvote 7)

Objective

To assist the agri-food industry in the following: development of facilities, equipment, and processes; research and

development; technology transfer; and coordination of environmental programs.

Program Administration

This program facilitates development of manure management technology, and development of value-added equipment and processes through administering legislation and programs. It also develops plans and standards, and assists in the development of facilities which meet animal and human welfare requirements.

Livestock (Subvote 15)

Obiective

To develop strategies to increase the economic returns to Saskatchewan from animal agri-food industries.

Program Administration

This program administers legislative responsibilities; ensures the protection of livestock ownership and compliance with livestock identification, dealer licensing, marketing, and transportation regulations; and provides branch support services. The program also identifies issues and constraints to develop policies and programs promoting and expanding the economic impact of all animal agri-food industries in Saskatchewan including dairy, pork, beef, and non-traditional livestock industries such as horses, game farming, game birds, sheep and rabbits.

Soils and Crops (Subvote 16)

Objective

To improve the sustainability of the Saskatchewan crop industry by specialist services and programs; to diversify, develop and protect field, forage, horticultural, honey and wild rice crops; and to maintain and improve soil productivity.

Program Administration

This program identifies opportunities and constraints and develops and implements programs, policies, and legislation to benefit the competitiveness, diversification and development of Saskatchewan crop industries. It also develops and implements programs, policies, and legislation to improve the sustainability of Saskatchewan crop industries through amelioration of the effects of modern crop production technology on soil quality, the environment and the general public.

Veterinary Services (Subvote 17)

Objective

To safeguard and promote animal health through veterinary service and advice.

Program Administration

This program provides laboratory services to the livestock sector and meat inspection services. It also provides production, research, education and disease management services, along with pathology services for veterinarians and the public.

Economics (Subvote 19)

Objective

To improve the economic environment facing Saskatchewan farmers and to assist farmers in making effective management decisions

Program Administration

This program co-ordinates the design and delivery of farm management information and training, market analysis, trade analysis, and agricultural statistical data for the agricultural sector. It also provides the administration and design of agricultural income support and stabilization programs.

Agriculture Development Secretariat (Subvote 112)

Objective

To advise and assist businesses and industries to diversify the agri-food economic base in Saskatchewan.

Program Administration

This program provides assistance with the following: identifying and evaluating market opportunities; providing agrifood businesses and industries with advice and information on marketing, strategic and business planning, and financing; and developing government strategies to address the development needs of the agri-food industry.

Counselling and Assistance for Farmers — Administration (Subvote 99)

Objective

To assist farmers by counselling in farm financial management to improve the viability of the farm operation.

Program Administration

This program provides recommendations to improve a farm's viability such as changes in the production and management techniques, improved communications between the farmer and lender, and a provincial government guarantee for an operating loan and/or a consolidated loan.

Farm Stress Management (Subvote 9)

Objective

To provide rural residents with counselling at initial stages of financial, personal, and family crisis; and to intervene in life threatening situations, thereby reducing high cost remedial service.

Program Administration

This program is designed to address the perceived absence of human service options for rural residents of the Province. It also recognizes that individuals and families are often unfamiliar with the range of government and community programs available to them, are traditionally reluctant to access services because of strong feelings of independence and concerns regarding confidentiality, and when under stress, are unable to cope with complex searches for desired services.

Extension (Subvote 33)

Objective

Promotes agricultural industry development and more diversified farm communities.

Program Administration

Extension Service promotes agricultural development through leadership, knowledge transfer, and service to rural Saskatchewan farm families, producers, and commodity groups. Today Extension Service has a broader vision of the need to serve the industry and the need to add value to primary products. This role includes promoting secondary processing and employment creation, and encouraging local development initiatives through community groups and leaders.

Grant to the Agricultural Credit Corporation of Saskatchewan for administration pursuant to The Agricultural Credit Corporation of Saskatchewan Act (Subvote 13)

Objective

To strengthen agriculture through leadership and innovation by providing financing to farmers with intensive agricultural operations.

Program Administration

The Agricultural Credit Corporation of Saskatchewan assists farmers to establish, develop, and maintain viable farm operations through long-term loans for purposes for which financing is not readily available.

Assistance to general agricultural interests or purposes (Subvote 2)

Objective

To provide financial assistance to agricultural organizations and/or groups for the provision of services to the agricultural industry.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to agricultural organizations which provide services to the agricultural industry, administrative assistance, and financial assistance to support the agri-food sector.

Payment to the Prairie Agricultural Machinery Institute (Subvote 47)

Objective

To improve the design and aid in the selection and use of agricultural machinery in the Prairie Provinces.

Program Administration

This program provides physical testing and engineering services to Saskatchewan and Manitoba manufacturers of agricultural machinery and assists equipment manufacturers in their efforts to diversify their product line. It also publishes evaluation reports on farm machinery to assist farmers with machinery purchasing and operating decisions.

Grants under the 4-H Program (Subvote 36)

Objective

To develop responsible and community minded youth through education and skill development.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to 4-H clubs for the development of community minded youth through education and skill development. The 4-H members participate in projects relating to beef, lighthorse, crafts, swine, foods, and other topics. Graduates from the 4-H program are recognized for having a superior level of public speaking and communication skills.

Matching grants for international aid (Subvote 95)

Objective

To provide matching of funds raised in the Province for specific agricultural and other development projects in Third World Countries.

Program Administration

This program supports projects which assist the recipients to become self supporting and independent of aid. The emphasis of the program is on agricultural development projects although a mix of projects in a number of disciplines is being supported.

Payments under the Ethanol Production and Marketing Incentive Program (Subvote 6)

Objective

To foster development of ethanol production facilities for diversification and development of the rural economy.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance for each of the first four years of production to producers under contract to a supplier who sells the ethanol-blended gasoline in Saskatchewan

Payments pursuant to the Canadian Crop Drought Assistance Program (Subvote 22)

Objective

To provide farmers with financial assistance to seed their 1990 crops.

Program Administration

This program assisted persons farming land located in Saskatchewan on August 1, 1989. A \$5.50 payment per cultivated acre was paid to help fund the costs associated with seeding. The program was initially paid for by the Federal Government; the Province will repay it's related portion of the program over a five year period.

Payment to the Agriculture Development Fund (Subvote 5)

Objective

To support the development and diversification of Saskatchewan's agriculture and food sector.

Program Administration

To assist in a broad range of initiatives related to: crops and forages, irrigation, soils, livestock, land improvement engineering, economics, extension, marketing, new product development, and food processing.

Payment to the Agriculture Development Fund pursuant to CanadaSaskatchewan Agreements (Subvote 29)

Objective

To support the development and diversification of Saskatchewan's agriculture and food sector through participation in Federal/Provincial Agreements.

Program Administration

This program provides the funding and administration for agricultural research, development, and on-farm demonstration activities through the Canada/Saskatchewan Agreement on Soils Conservation and the Memorandum of Understanding supporting farm management training.

Grant to the Agricultural Credit Corporation of Saskatchewan for interest subsidy pursuant to The Agricultural Credit Corporation of Saskatchewan Act (Subvote 83)

Objective

To provide financing to farmers at incentive rates.

Program Administration

This program provides a subsidy for the shortfall between the cost of capital and the actual return on its loans. The financial programs are provided to a variety of areas within the farming sector, for example: capital loans, livestock loans, and operating loans.

Grant to the Agricultural Credit Corporation of Saskatchewan for an allowance for losses on loans pursuant to The Agricultural Credit Corporation of Saskatchewan Act (Subvote 84)

Objective

To provide a loan loss provision on the capital loan program for farmers.

Program Administration

This program funds losses on loans, changes to the allowance for losses on loans, and payments of claims under the various loan guarantees provided to commercial lenders by the Corporation.

Payments pursuant to The Saskatchewan Agricultural Returns Stabilization Fund (Subvote 61)

Objective

To provide producers of beef, hogs, honey, beans, and lambs with protection against short term variations in commodity prices.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to agricultural organizations which administer stabilization programs on behalf of the Provincial Government.

Counselling and Assistance for Farmers — Implementation of guarantees

(Subvote 105)

Objective

To provide funding for farm loans which are guaranteed and are in default to the lending institution.

Program Administration

This program provides recommendations to improve a farm's viability, if possible. An operating loan may be guaranteed if a farm is determined to be viable. The program covers all guarantees in the case of default.

Payments pursuant to the Feed Grain Adjustment Program (Subvote 20)

Objective

To encourage the feeding of animals intended for slaughter by providing a direct payment to producers for feed grain consumed by eligible livestock.

Program Administration

This program provides payment to producers of livestock which are fed only in Saskatchewan and are destined for slaughter. Payment is based on weight gain and per tonne of grain fed for eligible heifers, steers, virgin bulls, cull cows, hogs, lambs, horses, goats, and game animals.

Payments of interest rebates pursuant to The Farm Purchase Program Act (Subvote 30)

Objective

To provide financial assistance to offset high interest costs and to ensure stable interest rates for the first ten years of a farmland purchase.

Program Administration

This program pays interest rebates equal to the difference between payments at available interest rates and what payments would be at 8% for the first five years. For the last five years, rebate grants equal the difference between payments at available rates and 12%.

Grant to the Agricultural Credit Corporation of Saskatchewan for Counselling and Assistance For Farmers — loan guarantees (Subvote 31)

Objective

To provide funding for farm loans which are guaranteed and are in default to the lending institution.

Program Administration

This program provides recommendations to improve a farm's viability, if possible. An operating loan may be guaranteed if a farm is determined to be viable. The program covers all guarantees in the case of default.

Loan loss provisions pursuant to The Production Association's Loan Guarantee Program (Subvote 32)

Objective

To provide payment under Production Association Loan Guarantees.

Program Administration

Under this program, government guarantees to lenders 25% of the amount a producer association is authorized to borrow for the purchase of feeder cattle and female breeding stock.

Payments pursuant to the Gross Revenue Insurance Program (Subvote 24)

Obiective

To provide grain and oilseed producers with gross revenue protection through a combination of crop insurance and revenue insurance.

Program Administration

This program provides a revenue guarantee to producers, based on an indexed moving average price of the commodities and the potential yield of a farm. The farmer receives a payment whenever the revenue from actual production is below the guarantee. The associated costs are funded both federally and provincially; however, the program is administered provincially.

Payments pursuant to the Net Income Stabilization Account (Subvote 26)

Objective

To help farmers establish stabilization accounts to assist in achieving consistency in their annual income.

Program Administration

Producers can contribute up to 2% of net sales of eligible commodities to stabilization accounts. Contributions to accounts will be matched by governments. Producers can contribute an additional 20% to the account, but it will not be matched. Producer contributions earn interest at 3% above the monthly market rate.

Payment from the accounts are made when current year farm income (a farmer's gross sales minus eligible operating expenses) is below their five year average or income is below \$10,000 per individual.

Interim Red Meat Production Equalization Program (Subvote 38)

Objective

The Interim Red Meat Production Equalization Program (IRMPEP) promotes economic activity, resulting from livestock finishing, by encouraging producers to finish eligible animals in Saskatchewan for slaughter. Maintaining a strong finishing sector in Saskatchewan means job creation, capital investment, and growth in related industries.

Program Administration

Owners of eligible livestock qualify for a grant provided a minimum number of animals are marketed yearly and meet grade or live weight requirements. Livestock must be fed only in Saskatchewan, and designated for slaughter. The amount of the grant is determined by weight gained while feeding.

Community Services (Vote 24)

The Department's mandate is to maintain and enhance the quality of life for Saskatchewan residents through the provision of a range of financial assistance, technical advice, and advisory services which support an effective decision-making structure in Saskatchewan communities; to provide local services and facilities; and policy development, coordination and facilitation of sport, culture, and recreation development.

Administration (Subvote 1)

Objective

To provide efficient and effective administrative support to the department; to inform the department's client groups of its programs and services.

Program Administration

This program provides support and services in accounting, asset acquisition/maintenance, human resource planning/development, computer service planning/maintenance, and acts as central control for delegated authorities. It also plans, develops, and implements public awareness programs; supports staff in communications activities; liaises with media and client groups; and fosters a positive image of the department.

Financial Assistance and Policy Services (Subvote 2)

Objective

To manage financial assistance programs and carry out financial analysis relating to local government; to provide the department with policy and program analysis and development, problem solving, issue managing, strategic planning services, and preparation of legislation and regulations.

Program Administration

This program administers various financial and municipal grants; undertakes research and analysis to provide advice on municipal financial matters; and maintains information bases of municipal finance and financial assistance.

It also provides service and support to the department in respect of policy and program analysis and development, preparation of legislation and regulations, problem solving, issue management, and strategic planning.

Community Development (Subvote 3)

Objective

To provide a framework for land use management in the Province, and to enhance the planning capability of urban governments by providing community planning, advice, and assistance; to support and assist urban municipalities in meeting their administrative and governing responsibilities by providing advisory, educational, and regulatory services; to promote fire prevention and fire protection in communities; to ensure building safety through setting and monitoring standards, and assisting municipalities in the application of standards.

Program Administration

This program provides an approval for the subdivision of land in urban municipallties; reviews municipal development plans, basic planning statements, and zoning bylaws for Ministerial approval; advises municipalities on land use planning and development issues; offers educational programs (manuals and workshops) on planning for municipal officials; and reviews applications for municipal boundary alterations and incorporations of new urban municipalities for Cabinet or Ministerial approval.

It provides advice on problems and procedures relating to legislative, accounting, and general administrative matters; develops education and reference materials for urban municipal officials on legislative and administrative procedures; provides workshops on administrative procedures to address the special needs of smaller municipalities; provides workshops on a variety of topics to all municipalities; and monitors the operations of urban municipalities to ensure they are consistent with provincial legislation.

This program provides building inspection, investigation of fires, fire fighters training, training to staff of hospitals and special care homes, and public education; and reviews plans for the prevention of fire.

This program also sets provincial building and accessibility standards which are based on the Nation Building Code of Canada; monitors standards; provides administrative and enforcement services to municipalities; and assists municipalities, building owners, contractors, and designers in the application of standards.

Northern Affairs (Subvote 15)

Objective

To assist and promote the development of strong and effective local municipal governments in northern Saskatchewan; to facilitate, promote, and coordinate socio-economic development in northern Saskatchewan by working with northern communities, government agencies, and northern industries.

Program Administration

This program provides administrative support and delivery of department programs and services, including the provision of municipal advisory services and financial assistance, to northern municipalities; administration of the Northern Revenue Sharing Trust Account and through it, provision of administrative and financial services to 10 northern settlements and 14 recreational subdivisions. It also provides administration of municipal assessment and property taxation for 12 northern hamlets, school taxation for 3 northern divisions, liaison with the public and other government departments and agencies, and provision of education and training to northern municipal officials.

It ensures government policies, programs, and structures support community, regional, and industry development. It coordinates existing programs and services to meet the needs and aspirations of northern communities and developing industries; assists government in the development of strategies for dealing with northern issues; develops community-industry-government working "partnerships" and communication links; and provides technical advice and assistance for communities undertaking planning and development.

Saskatchewan Library (Subvote 55)

Objective

To provide equal access to library resources for Saskatchewan residents.

Program Administration

This program serves provincial public libraries by providing cataloguing services and support; coordinating the lending of books between libraries; providing answers to reference questions from the public; supporting government and special libraries; buying books not available in other libraries, including books not in English, large print books, and books on cassette for the print handicapped; providing access to resources by maintaining union catalogues of books and periodicals owned by the public, government, and special libraries in Saskatchewan; and providing training/workshops/province-wide programs to other libraries.

Emergency Measures Organization (Subvote 19)

Objective

To promote and coordinate emergency preparation and disaster response by all levels of government.

Program Administration

This program prepares and maintains the provincial government emergency response plan; serves as the central coordinating agency for provincial government resources during a state of emergency; ensures all government departments, Crown corporations and agencies comply with the Cabinet directive for emergency planning; and assists in the development of local government emergency organizations and plans.

Housing (Subvote 85)

Objective

To assist in development and delivery of programs that improve the affordability, quality, and availability of housing for residents, particularly low income households.

Program Administration

This program develops, delivers, and administers all aspects of housing programs in Saskatchewan. Low income households receive support for suitable accommodation by subsidizing their shelter costs to 25% of income. This program also administers past loans/mortgage initiatives designed to improve housing quality or promote home purchase; and provides grants to people with disabilities for home modification and provides grants to support research and development.

Office of the French Language Coordination (Subvote 94)

(Transferred to Provincial Secretary, October 1, 1992.)

Objective

To assist government departments in offering Frenchlanguage services to Saskatchewan's francophone community.

Program Administration

The program coordinates provincial French-language initiatives; provides linguistic support and translation services to government departments; liaises with the francophone community; and pursues measures respecting the advancement of French in the Legislative Assembly.

Heritage (Subvote 97)

Objective

To ensure the conservation, management, and development of heritage resources to ensure people of Saskatchewan access their full social and economic benefits.

Program Administration

This program administers the operation of the Museum of Natural History and Government House Historic Property and assists in the storage, preservation, display, and maintenance of heritage items and property.

Arts and Multiculturalism (Subvote 98)

Objective

To provide leadership in the arts and multiculturalism through the coordinated development of policy, legislation, and program direction.

Program Administration

This program coordinates with other government agencies (federal/provincial/municipal) and the non-government sectors, the development of policies, legislation, and program direction in the arts and multiculturalism field. This includes issues that affect individual artists, arts and multicultural organizations, as well as areas such as intercultural understanding and racism.

Recreation (Subvote 99)

Objective

To improve the quality of life for all residents by supporting sport and recreation development.

Program Administration

This program provides an overall direction to the sport and recreation delivery system in the Province, ensuring equal access to quality participation opportunities for all citizens. This is done through liaison with sport and recreation associations such as Sask Sport Inc., Saskatchewan Parks and Recreation Association, zone sport councils, regional recreation associations, recreation boards, and universities/technical institutes and through the promotion of recreation as a community development strategy.

Museum of Natural History (Capital) (Subvote 37)

Objective

To provide a facility for historical displays for Saskatchewan people and tourists.

Program Administration

This program provides research, conservation, exhibition, education, and curatorial programs aimed at a greater appreciation for and understanding of the Province's natural

and human history. It also provides for museum redevelopment and new development of the First Nations Gallery.

Payments to Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation (Subvote 82)

Objective

To fund the department's expenditure for the services relating to accommodation, mail services, photo services, records management, and capital repayment.

Program Administration

This program provides support and delivery of all related services.

Urban Revenue Sharing (Subvote 24)

Objective

To provide unconditional operating assistance to urban municipalities, and provide for inter-municipal equalization to ensure a basic level of service is available to municipalities.

Program Administration

This program provides unconditional financial assistance to local governments based on a distribution formula. The nature of the assistance allows local governments to direct funds where they are needed most in their community.

Grants to municipalities and organizations for local studies and research (Subvote 33)

Objective

To support research into urban and municipal issues.

Program Administration

Saskatchewan is a member of the Board of Directors of the Intergovernmental Committee on Urban and Regional Research (ICURR). This committee focuses on exchanging views and current information on urban/rural and regional issues.

Northern Revenue Sharing (Subvote 44)

Objective

To provide unconditional operating assistance to northern municipalities and provide for inter-municipal equalization to ensure a basic level of service is available to municipalities.

Program Administration

This program provides financial operating grant assistance to northern municipalities; monitors their financial operations; and assists in the establishment of annual operating budgets.

To provide for a grant to the Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency (Statutory) (Subvote 79)

Objective

To provide provincial funding to the Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency (SAMA). SAMA is responsible for determining property and business assessments and assessment policy.

Program Administration

This program assesses the buildings and land outside of Regina and Saskatoon to determine a mill rate which in turn determines property taxes. Information is also used to determine grants provided to municipalities.

Grants to municipalities under the Transit Assistance for the Disabled Program (Subvote 86)

Obiective

To financially support and encourage communities operating special public transportation services for persons with physical disabilities.

Program Administration

This program provides grants to participating cities and towns for providing door-to-door public transit for people with disabilities and assists in the acquisition of specially equipped vans or buses.

Municipalities are responsible for establishing their own operating policies and procedures for the services. Services may be operated by the municipality or on its behalf by other organizations or private firms.

Grants to Libraries (Subvote 56)

Objective

To assist in the operation of municipal, regional, and northern libraries in Saskatchewan.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance for the purchase of library materials or the provision of library services.

Grant to the Meewasin Valley Authority (Statutory) (Subvote 57)

Grant to the Wakamow Valley Authority (Statutory) (Subvote 58)

Grant to the Wascana Centre Authority (Statutory) (Subvote 59)

Grant to the City of Swift Current for the Chinook Parkway (Subvote 69)

Objective

To provide financial assistance to support urban parks in enhancing the quality of life for residents, stimulating tourism, supporting economic development, and contributing to natural conservation.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance for operations and capital purposes to meet the objectives of the Authorities. Each urban park is a separate entity with its own participating parties, with each of these contributing financially.

Payment to Wascana Centre Authority for maintenance of grounds (Subvote 60)

(Transferred to Provincial Secretary, October 1, 1992.)

Objective

To provide financial support for landscape maintenance performed by the Authority on provincial government land within Wascana Centre.

Program Administration

This program provides for charging back to the respective participating parties in the Centre (Province, City of Regina, University of Regina) the costs of landscape and service maintenance performed by the Authority on their respective lands within the Centre.

The Authority determines the type, level, and location of landscape maintenance it can provide within the funds provided. Service maintenance is determined by negotiation with participating parties.

Transfer payments to the Saskatchewan Housing Corporation (Subvote 92)

Objective

To improve the quality of life for Saskatchewan residents through housing related support initiatives. This includes shelter support for households in need, land development services, and mortgage/loan administration.

Program Administration

The Saskatchewan Housing Corporation provides low income households with support for suitable accommodation by subsidizing their shelter costs to 25% of income; develops serviced lots in cooperation with local communities where land is held; and administers past loans/mortgage initiatives designed to improve housing quality or promote home purchase.

Payments to municipalities pursuant to downtown development agreements (Subvote 96)

Objective

To provide financial assistance pursuant to provincial obligations under downtown development agreements.

Program Administration

This program provides a payment to the City of Prince Albert to cover a portion of revenue shortfall relative to annual debenture payments pursuant to a downtown revitalization agreement signed in 1980.

Grant to the Saskatchewan Archives Board (Subvote 4)

Objective

To manage and assist in conservation of government records, historical documents, and other important references and records.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to manage the conservation of government records, historical documents, and manuscripts. It also provides a reference service to the public for access to these records.

Grant to The Saskatchewan Centre of the Arts (Subvote 5)

Objective

To provide a facility for various cultural activities in Saskatchewan.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance in the operation of the Centre of the Arts in order to provide Saskatchewan residents with the opportunity to attend various cultural activities

Payment to Cumberland House (Subvote 93)

Objective

To provide for the social and economic development of the residents of the Cumberland House region.

Program Administration

This program assists the residents of the Cumberland House region to develop and stimulate economic growth.

Fire Fighters Training and Support Program (Subvote 38)

Objective

To support improved training of fire fighters.

Program Administration

This program provides for acquisition of additional fire fighter training materials and equipment in order to provide access to training materials at a regional/local level; and the preparation of new instructional materials. A fire fighter training program is provided by provincial staff and volunteer association personnel.

Inter-Municipal Co-operation Assistance (Subvote 100)

Objective

To encourage new initiatives and approaches in intercommunity and inter-municipal cooperation and help protect community quality of life.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to urban or northern municipalities and project partners, for initiating projects which break new ground in approaches to intercommunity and inter-municipal cooperation.

To provide for subsidies under the Urban Native Housing Program (Subvote 87)

Objective

To provide affordable rental accommodation to Native households in urban centres.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to Native non-profit housing corporations for the operation of subsidized rental housing projects. Mortgages on the projects are subsidized by the federal government at a rate of 2%. The Province provides additional operating subsidies to ensure that rents do not exceed 25% of household income.

To provide for grants under the Home Modification for the Disabled Program (Subvote 90)

Objective

To assist disabled people in changing the design or accessibility of their home to make it more suitable and livable.

Program Administration

This program provides people with disabilities with financial assistance to modify their own dwelling, or a rented dwelling with the permission of the landlord. The assistance only covers the actual cost of the modification. Parents/guardians with disabled dependents are eligible providing they meet the income criteria.

To provide for interest subsidies under the Saskatchewan Home Improvement Program (Subvote 91)

Objective

To assist home owners with repairs, rehabilitation, or improvements to their principle residence that will extend the life of the home or protect the health, safety, or comfort of the occupants.

Program Administration

This program ran from 1986 to 1990 and offered homeowners a low interest loan of up to \$10,000. The loans are repayable over a maximum of 10 years and subsidized to a rate of 6%. The Province pays an interest rate subsidy directly to the lending institutions which extended loans to home owners.

Crown Investments Corporation of Saskatchewan (Vote 54)

Subsidy for the net operating loss of the Crown Investments Corporation of Saskatchewan (Subvote 1)

The Crown Investments Corporation of Saskatchewan acts as a financial holding company and oversees the operation of those commercial Crown Corporations under its review. This subvote provides a subsidy to Crown Investments Corporation to ensure its retained earnings do not go into a negative position.

Grant Payments

All expenditures paid from this vote were grants to the Crown Investments Corporation of Saskatchewan.

Subsidy for the net operating loss of the Crown Investments Corporation of Saskatchewan (Subvote 1)......\$ 4,879,000

Economic Development (Vote 45)

The Department's mandate is to expand and diversify the Saskatchewan economy in partnership with stakeholders.

Administration and Human Resources (Subvote 1)

Objective

To provide leadership, direction, and support to assist the department to achieve expansion and diversification of the Saskatchewan economy.

Program Administration

This program provides administrative support in the areas of human resource management, financial and administrative support services, and information and technology requirements; and provides coordination and liaison support with various government agencies in order to achieve a single focus on all economic development processes.

Policy and Research (Subvote 21)

Objective

To develop timely program direction and advise on economic development and trade issues for the department and the Legislature.

Program Administration

This program provides timely focused advice on policy issues to further provincial economic diversification; develops new policy and program initiatives; and works with private sector organizations, businesses, and federal and provincial government departments to identify issues and opportunities. This program provides Government with technical expertise on trade policy; identifies negotiating objectives; and formulates provincial positions and strategies.

Communications (Subvote 36)

Objective

To coordinate, develop, and deliver communications activities in support of departmental programs.

Program Administration

This program designs and delivers communications strategies to support individual programs and initiatives; liaises with program areas and the media to arrange interviews and news conferences; researches, writes, and coordinates public affairs requirements for news releases, speeches, articles, brochures, and other written communications; and designs, develops, and implements advertising strategies.

Diversification and Investment (Subvote 30)

Objective

To expand and diversify the Saskatchewan economy by working directly with existing and potential Saskatchewan businesses.

Program Administration

This program assists existing and potential Saskatchewan companies to expand and diversify their operations by identifying and assisting with domestic procurement and international trade opportunities; providing technical, financial, and marketing advise; and identifying potential investment sources.

Tourism (Subvote 4)

Objective

To expand the Saskatchewan economy through increasing tourism revenues in partnership with the Saskatchewan tourism industry.

Program Administration

This program, in partnership with the tourism industry, develops Saskatchewan tourism destination markets and promotes tourism destinations both nationally and internationally.

Business Services and Co-operatives (Subvote 2)

Objective

To assist existing business and potential entrepreneurs to create and/or expand business activity in the Province. Through the Co-operatives Directorate, to promote and support the use of co-operative structures, principles, and business practices to strengthen and enhance the Province's economy and society.

Program Administration

This program provides business libraries and professional consultative services to people starting or expanding any business through a "hands-on" approach based on an individual's requirements. Through the Co-operatives Directorate, the program strengthens government and co-operative sector relations, pursues beneficial diversification initiatives and promotes community economic development.

Payments to Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation (Subvote 33)

Objective

To assist the department in managing accommodation and central services.

Program Administration

Payments are made to the Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation for office accommodations, mail and photo services, records management, and minor renovations.

To provide an operating subsidy to the Northern Saskatchewan Economic Development Revolving Fund (Subvote 39)

Objective

To provide additional funding to the Northern Saskatchewan Economic Development Revolving Fund.

Program Administration

The Northern Saskatchewan Economic Development Revolving Fund encourages economic and business development. Revenue generated is retained by the Fund to offset costs. Any excess profits are returned to the Consolidated Fund

To provide for a net expenditure (recovery) of (from) the Northern Saskatchewan Economic Development Revolving Fund (Statutory) (Subvote 20)

Objective

To stimulate economic and business development, enhance employment opportunities, and expand manufacturing and service sectors in northern Saskatchewan.

Program Administration

The Northern Saskatchewan Economic Development Revolving Fund evaluates loan financing proposals by applying conventional lending principles; prepares and issues loan security documentation, registers loan securities, disposes of loan proceeds, and performs compliance audits. It collects loan accounts receivable and liaises with other public and private lending, granting, or economic development agencies, provincial regulatory agencies, and accounting and legal professionals. Revenue is retained by the revolving fund and the net expenditure (recovery) for the fiscal year is a charge to the Consolidated Fund.

Payments for Advanced Technology Development Projects (Subvote 40)

Objective

To accelerate the growth of the advanced technology sector, diversify the economy, secure federal research funds, and provide jobs.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to the advanced technology industry by sharing the risk of innovation and new product development with advanced technology companies, research organizations, and universities.

Payments for Export Development Projects (Subvote 41)

Objective

To assist Saskatchewan companies to sell goods and services in new markets outside Saskatchewan.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to companies and organizations to support international marketing of Saskatchewan goods and services.

Payments for Industrial Development Projects (Subvote 42)

Objective

To stimulate investment and job creation in manufacturing and processing.

Program Administration

This program provided an incentive of \$7,500 for each new job created to a maximum of 25% of the new capital investment in plant and equipment. Applications were accepted from April 1, 1984 to March 31, 1987. It also provides administrative support until payouts for all approved projects are completed. Incentives are paid on the basis of an audit.

Payments for Business Development Projects (Subvote 43)

Objective

To stimulate the diversification of the Saskatchewan economy by encouraging equity investments by Saskatchewan residents in Saskatchewan-based companies.

Program Administration

These programs provided an incentive to each investor who invested capital into an eligible Saskatchewan-based business. Applications were accepted from April 1, 1984 to March 31, 1992. It also provides administrative support until payouts to investors for all approved projects are completed.

Payments for Tourism Development Projects (Subvote 44)

Objective

To assist key private sector, non-profit, and tourism groups with priority initiatives that fit local, regional, and provincial tourism strategies.

Program Administration

This program provides financial support for priority tourism initiative outlines in community tourism plans. It also assists in the development of major travel generators, destination and packages, and association business plans.

Education (Vote 5)

The mandate of the Department is to provide leadership in the development and operation of education and training in the Province. The focus is on responding to the learning needs of all Saskatchewan people in the context of the economic and social needs and realities of the Province.

Administration (Subvote 2)

Objective

To provide executive direction, leadership and central administration, financial and human resource management, planning and policy development, and central computer services to the department.

Program Administration

This program provides financial management and administrative support to the department in the centrally administered functions of accounting, asset acquisition, budgeting, communications, human resources, planning, and policy development.

Student Aid Operations (Subvote 67)

Objective

To administer Canada and Saskatchewan loans for students enrolled in approved post-secondary programs.

Program Administration

This program provides administrative support and delivery of the various financial assistance programs including: Canada Student Loans, Saskatchewan Student Loans, Forgivable Loans, Loan Remission for Special Incentive Students, Interest Write Down Program, and Provincial Interest Relief Plan. It also provides loan disbursement, repayment, and collection services on provincial student loans.

Advanced Education (Subvote 26)

Objective

To provide post-secondary and adult education program services to adults in Saskatchewan.

Program Administration

This program provides administrative support and delivery of various training programs and services including Apprenticeship and Trade Certification, academic and skill training for social assistance recipients, programs which enable greater participation by non-traditional students in technical vocations, training programs to enable native people to participate equally with others, and rehabilitative vocational training for disabled persons.

Curriculum and Special Education (Subvote 7)

Objective

To develop and implement English and other non-French language programs of study for students from kindergarten to grade 12; to assess and monitor curriculum implementation; and to maintain records of standing for all high school students

Program Administration

This program provides a variety of support services to assist in the preparation and delivery of curricula, including programs for children with disabilities, and maintains an accurate record of standing of high school students.

Field Services (Subvote 23)

Obiective

To work with boards of education, local school officials, and teachers in carrying out department initiatives.

Program Administration

This program provides administrative support and delivery of the division's programs and services including facilities planning, regional offices, teacher certification records and independent schools, legislation and school administration.

Official Minority Language Office (Subvote 50)

Objective

To oversee the delivery of designated and core French programs to Saskatchewan students.

Program Administration

This program provides administrative support and delivery of French programs to Saskatchewan students including curriculum development and coordination of federal-provincial programs which are aimed at promoting French in the Province.

Communications Policy (Subvote 20)

Objective

To develop and recommend policies with respect to the regulatory and technology areas of telecommunications, cable television, and the Saskatchewan Communications Network.

Program Administration

This program was disbanded as of May 7, 1992 and subsequently wound down over the next few months.

Payments to Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation (Subvote 64)

Objective

To provide for payments to the Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation for office accommodation, mail and photo services, records management, and minor renovation services

Program Administration

This program delivers a variety of centralized services including space, mail services, photographic services, and acquisition of supplies and services.

To provide for a net expenditure (recovery) of (from) the Saskatchewan Book Bureau Revolving Fund (Statutory) (Subvote 30)

Objective

To serve as a retail distributor of student and teacher resource books, workbooks, reference books, and related print and nonprint material for use in Saskatchewan schools.

Program Administration

The Saskatchewan Book Bureau Revolving Fund provides administrative support and provides for the purchase and sale of student textbooks, teacher manuals, and educational resource books to schools. Revenue generated is retained by the fund and serves to offset the costs of providing the service. The net expenditure (recovery) for a fiscal year is a charge to the Consolidated Fund.

To provide for a net expenditure (recovery) of (from) the Correspondence School Revolving Fund (Statutory) (Subvote 62)

Objective

To provide learning opportunities for high school students and adults throughout the Province and for Saskatchewan people who are temporarily residing outside of the Province.

Program Administration

The Correspondence School Revolving Fund provides administrative support and delivery of 66 grades 9 to 12 credit courses. Revenues generated are retained by the fund and serve to offset the costs of providing education to students and adults. The net expenditure (recovery) for a fiscal year is a charge to the Consolidated Fund.

Grants to Saskatchewan Universities and Federated Colleges (Subvote 19)

Objective

To provide financial assistance for the operation of Saskatchewan's universities and federated colleges which provide post-secondary education to students in Saskatchewan.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance in the form of an operating grant to the universities and federated colleges in the Province to enable them to provide education to students in the Province.

Post Secondary (Capital) (Subvote 69)

Objective

To finance capital loans used for construction and renovations at post-secondary institutions in the Province.

Program Administration

This program provides funding for capital loans used for construction and renovations at universities, and federated and regional colleges.

Grants to Regional Colleges (Subvote 8)

Objective

To provide financial assistance for the operational expenditures of the regional colleges' technical training, university extension courses, life-skill courses, and non-credit courses offered to adults in rural Saskatchewan.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to the regional colleges to assist in the operation of technical training, university extension courses, life-skill courses, and non-credit courses to adults in rural Saskatchewan.

Grants to educational agencies, organizations, associations and institutions (Subvote 9)

Objective

To provide financial assistance for education initiatives sponsored by educational agencies, organizations, associations, and institutions.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance for initiatives such as the Northern Teacher Education Program, Saskatchewan Urban Native Teacher Education Program, Gabriel Dumont Institute and the affiliated colleges, and other educational institutions and associations.

Grant to the Saskatchewan Institute of Applied Science and Technology

(Subvote 61)

Objective

To provide financial assistance to the Saskatchewan Institute of Applied Science and Technology (SIAST) for technical/vocational skill training, university credit courses as well as upgrading and pre-employment programs.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to SIAST for the operation of various training programs aimed at upgrading the educational level of Saskatchewan residents.

Grant to provide for expenditures respecting the Saskatchewan Communications Network Authority (Subvote 73)

Objective

To support the delivery of educational training and informational programming and to provide financial assistance for post-secondary educational initiatives.

Program Administration

This program provides administrative support for the delivery of various department programs and initiatives including distance education, and rural training. It also provides financial assistance to the universities, regional colleges and Saskatchewan Institute of Applied Science and Technology campuses for post-secondary educational initiatives, adult Correspondence School subsidy, Library Outreach at universities, and Saskatchewan Skills Extension Program.

Education Outreach Fund (Subvote 63)

Objective

To provide assistance in the delivery of department programs and to improve access for rural and northern Saskatchewan residents.

Program Administration

This program provides administrative support for the delivery of various department programs and initiatives including Distance Education, Library Outreach, and Rural Training. It also provides financial assistance to the universities, regional colleges, and Saskatchewan Institute of Applied Science and Technology campuses for post-secondary education initiatives.

Grants to Schools — Operation (Subvote 54)

Objective

To distribute provincial funding to school boards on an equitable basis for the operation of Saskatchewan's kindergarten to grade 12 schools.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to each school division in order that they can provide education to Saskatchewan's kindergarten to grade 12 students.

Grants to Schools — Construction (Capital) (Subvote 55)

Objective

To provide financial assistance for repayment of debt for the construction and maintenance of school facilities.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to school divisions in order to repay funds the department used for the construction of new schools.

Education Development Fund (Subvote 72)

Objective

To finance improvements to Saskatchewan's kindergarten to grade 12 education system.

Program Administration

This program provides funding to school divisions to upgrade learning resources, improve school efficiency, and improve the quality of educational programs.

Grant to the Saskatchewan Student Aid Fund (Subvote 4)

Objective

To provide financial assistance for the operation of the Student Aid Fund which financially assists students in various post-secondary programs.

Program Administration

This program provides funding in the way of loan remission, loan forgiveness, and student loan interest subsidies to eligible students enrolled in approved post-secondary programs.

Training Programs (Subvote 57)

Objective

To provide financial assistance for training programs for postsecondary education and training allowances to qualified registrants.

Program Administration

This program provides funding for training programs targeted for the benefit of specific groups and includes the Non-Status Indian and Metis Program, Vocational Rehabilitation of Disabled Persons, Northern Training Program, Non-sponsored and Apprenticeship and Skills Upgrading, Suntep tuition fees, and out-of-province training literacy and special needs initiatives.

To provide for the administrative expenses of the Teachers' Superannuation Commission (Subvote 53)

Objective

To provide financial assistance for the administration of benefits for teachers.

Program Administration

This program collects superannuation contributions, and provides superannuation allowances and disability benefits; administers the Teachers' Group Life Insurance Plan and the Teachers' Dental Plan; and administers the Teachers' Voluntary Contribution Fund. It also monitors the investments of the superannuation fund and sets the investment policy and guidelines.

Teachers' pensions and cost of living bonus (Subvote 58)

Objective

To provide benefits to teachers and their dependents.

Program Administration

This program provides superannuation allowances to teachers who retire and to dependents of deceased teachers and of deceased superannuates. It also provides disability benefits to eligible teachers who are unable to continue teaching due to illness.

Saskatchewan Teachers' Retirement Plan (Subvote 74)

Objective

To provide funds for matching teacher contributions made to the Saskatchewan Teachers' Retirement Plan.

Program Administration

The Teachers' Superannuation Act requires the Minister of Finance to match contributions by teachers to the Saskatchewan Teachers' Retirement Plan, which is administered by the Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation.

Teachers' Group Life Insurance — Government contribution (Subvote 59)

Objective

To provide life insurance and accidental dismemberment coverage to teachers and secretary-treasurers of school divisions.

Program Administration

This program administers the underwriting contract with the insurance company including collection and subsequent payment of premiums, and the submission of death and dismemberment claims to the insurance company.

Payments Pursuant to The Teachers' Dental Plan Act (Subvote 60)

Objective

To provide dental coverage for teachers and their dependents.

Program Administration

This program administers the dental plan, including submission of dental claims to the life insurance company for claims adjudication/payment, and communication with teachers regarding the terms of the plan and status of claims being processed.

Energy and Mines (Vote 23)

The mandate of the Department is to achieve full and responsible development of Saskatchewan's energy and mineral resources; to create jobs and sustain economic activity in the Province; and to optimize revenues to fund government programs and services.

Administrative Services (Subvote 1)

Objective

To provide executive direction, leadership and central administration, financial and human resource management, central computer services, and a publications marketing service to the department.

Program Administration

This program provides leadership and direction, internal administration, personnel services, and legislative coordination; develops, coordinates, and maintains computer system services within the department; and produces, promotes, markets, and distributes information on Saskatchewan's resources to the resource industries and the general public.

Mineral Revenues (Subvote 10)

Objective

To collect and audit resource revenues from industry and maintain a registry of mineral rights.

Program Administration

This program implements and maintains appropriate mineral revenue collecting, recording, and auditing programs; and maintains a mineral ownership records system.

Geology and Mines (Subvote 4)

Objective

To identify and promote exploration and development opportunities to industry; collect and maintain geological and other technical data; and administer and lease Crown mineral rights.

Program Administration

This program performs geological and mineralogical studies; maintains a geoscientific data base; promotes resource development through publications, meetings, displays, and individual consultations; and assesses petroleum and mineral exploration results. It also monitors mining operations for conservation practices; maintains records of mining and exploration activities, production, and value of sales; and administers the sale of Crown lands for minerals, other than oil, gas, helium, and oil shale. The program also provides royalty and economic forecasts for base metals and gold, and negotiates arrangements for federal participation in mineral development.

Petroleum and Natural Gas (Subvote 8)

Objective

To promote the development of oil and natural gas by administering and leasing, to industry, Crown oil and gas rights; developing royalty and tax structures; collecting production and sales statistics; and enforcing conservation and environmental standards.

Program Administration

This program develops and implements royalties/taxes and incentives for oil and gas resources; analyzes markets and prices of oil and gas; develops and enforces policies to ensure minimal impact on the environment related to petroleum and natural gas development; and administers the petroleum and natural gas Crown mineral rights and their sale. It also promotes resource conservation; maintains a comprehensive database related to oil and gas; and provides information and services to the industry and the public.

Resource Policy and Economics (Subvote 14)

Objective

To promote resource development by developing royalty and tax structures; providing analysis and recommendations on policy matters to government; monitoring emerging issues; and negotiating with the federal government on issues of mutual concern.

Program Administration

This program provides the government with direction on energy and mineral pricing, taxation, markets, research and development, environmental issues and long term forecasting, federal/provincial issues and agreements, cost-effective recovery and utilization of resources, programs for the fossil fuel sector, tax incentives for the mineral sector, and the royalty/tax systems for industrial and metallic mineral resources.

Energy Sector Initiatives (Subvote 9)

Objective

To develop a comprehensive energy strategy for the Province; fund research and development work on specific energy technology opportunities; and develop a clean air strategy for the Province. It also provides funding for the Saskatchewan Energy Conservation and Development Authority.

Program Administration

This program continues development work on technology programs such as enhanced oil recovery, carbon dioxide recovery, and horizontal wells; funds energy market studies, energy forecasting studies, and energy conservation initiatives such as energy audits of buildings; and funds activities of the task force working on a clean air strategy for the Province. The program also provides funding for the Saskatchewan Energy Conservation and Development Authority.

Payments to Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation (Subvote 16)

Objective

To compensate the Corporation for the provision of accommodation and central services to the department.

Program Administration

This program provides payments for office, storage and laboratory accommodations, mail and photo services, records management, and minor renovation services.

To provide an operating subsidy to the Oil and Gas Revolving Fund (Subvote 2)

Objective

To provide additional funding to the Oil and Gas Revolving Fund.

Program Administration

The Oil and Gas Revolving Fund provides regulatory functions and a variety of services to the oil and gas industry. Revenue generated is retained by the Fund to offset costs. Any excess profits are returned to the Consolidated Fund.

To provide for a net expenditure (recovery) of (from) the Oil and Gas Revolving Fund (Statutory) (Subvote 3)

Objective

To obtain funds from the oil and gas industry and to provide certain services and regulatory functions to the industry.

Program Administration

The Oil and Gas Revolving Fund provides regulatory functions and a variety of services to the oil and gas industry. Revenue generated is retained by the Fund and serves to offset the costs of services provided. The net expenditure (recovery) for a fiscal year is a charge to the Consolidated Fund.

Payments for projects and administrative expenses for Saskatchewan Mineral Industry Diversification Program (Subvote 6)

Objective

To promote mineral exploration and development in order to establish new resource industries.

Program Administration

This program provides operational funding under a five year joint venture program with the federal government to promote new resources such as base and precious metals, diamonds, silica sand, brines, and building stone through field and laboratory studies. Results are made available to industry to promote investment in these resource areas.

Compensation payments pursuant to section 23 of The Crown Minerals Act for oil rights acquired by the Crown (Subvote 18)

Obiective

To provide compensation to former owners of oil rights.

Program Administration

This program provides compensation to former owners of oil rights in accordance with section 23 of *The Crown Minerals Act.*

Interest on refunds of taxes (Subvote 19)

Objective

To provide for payment of interest on refunds of taxes.

Program Administration

This program provides for processing of interest payments on refunds of taxes.

Payments required under the trust certificates attached to mineral titles transferred to the Crown in lieu of taxes (Subvote 20)

Objective

To provide compensation to holders of mineral trust certificates.

Program Administration

This program provides for processing of trust certificate payments.

Environment and Public Safety (Vote 9)

The Department's mandate is to protect and enhance the environment in a manner that promotes the physical, economic, and social well-being of the people of Saskatchewan today and in the future; and to provide and maintain safety standards for industry and the general public.

Corporate Services (Subvote 1)

Objective

To provide the department with corporate administrative, financial, human resource, system, and office support services; and develop, evaluate and implement department administrative policies.

Program Administration

This program provides overall management, program planning, resource allocation, and administrative support for the delivery of programs and services including purchasing, budgeting, financial reporting, payment processing, revenue collection, contract administration, Environmental Protection Fund administration, vehicle coordination, accommodation services, centralized human resources, library and record keeping, systems development, and management of computer operations.

Planning and Assessment (Subvote 20)

Objective

To plan for environmental protection and enhancement; assess proposed development projects for environmental implications; and coordinate the department's legislative, policy and planning, inter-governmental, and public affairs activities.

Program Administration

This program informs prospective developers about environmental protection requirements; evaluates development activities as to environmental implications; develops and implements new environmental initiatives; and identifies economic development opportunities directly related to environmental concerns. It also coordinates education, information, public involvement, and media relations.

Environmental Protection and Enforcement (Subvote 6)

Objective

To provide environmental protection and enforcement activities concerning air and water quality, waste management, and mining and milling operations.

Program Administration

This program is responsible for prevention of air pollution; promotion of rehabilitation of polluted or disturbed lands; management of land use activities; reduction of the amount of waste requiring disposal; protection of the environment at mining and milling operations; protection of the public from hazards associated with hazardous chemicals or waste dangerous goods; and protection of water quality through establishment of objectives for water and wastewater works and by monitoring and inspecting water and wastewater works.

Public Safety (Subvote 12)

Objective

To provide safety standards and regulatory programs to industry and the general public in the field of boiler and pressure vessel installations, elevating devices, and amusement rides; and to license people working in gas and electrical installation.

Program Administration

This program inspects all pressure vessels and boilers and related equipment; examines and licenses all power engineers, refrigeration plant operators, firemen, and pressure welders; licenses contractors, employers and trades persons making gas and electrical installations, suppliers of gas and electrical equipment, and propane distributors; and inspects and licenses all elevating devices and amusement rides installed/operated.

Uranium Board of Inquiry (Subvote 10)

Obiective

To provide for a board of inquiry into the environmental and related impacts of proposed uranium mine developments in Saskatchewan

Program Administration

This is a cost-shared program with the Federal Government to fund the operations of the Joint Federal-Provincial Environmental Assessment Panel on Proposed Uranium Mine Developments in Northern Saskatchewan.

Grants to organizations and persons concerned with environmental matters (Subvote 17)

Objective

To provide grants for environmental purposes.

Program Administration

This program provides grants, at the discretion of the Minister of Environment and Public Safety, to environmental organizations requesting financial assistance for operating funds or to undertake projects of an environmental nature.

Grant to the Water Appeal Board (Subvote 26)

Objective

To hear and determine appeals against decisions, orders, and actions made by the Water Corporation with respect to drainage complaints and drainage permit applications.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to the Water Appeal Board through the form of an operating grant based on budgeted requirements. The Water Appeal Board operates as a separate autonomous entity.

The Department's mandate is to provide organization and record keeping services to the Premier and Government and support to the Premier in his roles as: Head of Government; Chairman of Cabinet; Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs; Chairman of the Planning and Priorities Committee; and Head of the political party with the mandate to govern.

Administration (Subvote 1)

Objective

To provide executive direction, leadership and central administration, financial and human resource management, and central computer services to the department.

Program Administration

This program provides a coordination function between government departments, agencies, and Crown corporations, and Cabinet. It coordinates the overall government operations and appointments of senior executives for government departments and agencies. Also, it provides a service and control function for financial, personnel, systems development and maintenance, and space issues.

Media Services (Subvote 2)

Objective

To act as the central communications and information agency for the Government.

Program Administration

This program prepares, reviews, and distributes news releases; acts as the distribution centre for provincial government news releases; operates the radio and television facilities for news conferences; and provides coordination/consultative services to departments, agencies, Crown corporations, and commissions with respect to preparation of news releases.

Cabinet, Policy and Planning Secretariats (Subvote 4)

Objective

To provide secretariat support to the Executive Council.

Program Administration

This program maintains procedures for Cabinet to make policy decisions and monitors the implementation of these decisions. Cabinet Secretariat also maintains all Cabinet documents, orders-in-council, and regulations, and provides support to Cabinet committees. The Policy and Planning Secretariat provides analysis and support services to the Planning and Priorities Committee of Cabinet.

Intergovernmental Affairs (Subvote 9)

Obiective

To plan, coordinate, and manage the interactions between the Government of Saskatchewan and other governments.

Program Administration

This program coordinates, promotes, and fosters relations between Saskatchewan and other governments and manages government policy and programs involving the federal government, other provinces and territories, foreign jurisdictions, and international organizations.

Protocol Office (Subvote 13)

(Transferred to Provincial Secretary, October 1, 1992)

Objective

To facilitate visits of senior officials and delegations and to provide protocol consulting services.

Program Administration

This program plans, organizes, and supervises visits of foreign diplomats, heads of state, ministers, and delegations. It also provides protocol consulting services to government agencies and the general public, and administers honours programs such as the Saskatchewan Order of Merit.

Expenses of Conducting Votes under The Time Act (Subvote 7)

Objective

To provide the administrative function with respect to conducting votes.

Program Administration

This program provides for the administration of votes under *The Time Act* by providing Returning Officers, Polling Officials, polls, advertising, and ballots for time votes in the Province.

Grants to planning and research institutions (Subvote 15)

Objective

To provide an annual grant to the Canadian Intergovernmental Conference Secretariat (CICS).

Program Administration

This program provides a grant to the Canadian Intergovernmental Conference Secretariat (CICS) for secretariat support services which it provides in preparation for and during federal-provincial and inter-provincial meetings of First Ministers, Premiers, Ministers, and senior officials. The CICS is jointly funded by the federal and provincial governments.

Members of the Executive Council (Statutory) (Subvote 10)

Objective

To provide for the payment of salaries to Members of the Legislative Assembly in their capacities as Premier, Deputy Premier, and Cabinet Ministers.

Program Administration

This program administers the payment of salaries to Members of the Legislative Assembly in their capacities as Premier, Deputy Premier, and Cabinet Ministers.

Finance (Vote 18)

The Department's mandate is to administer various provincial taxes, and grant and refund programs; to arrange government financing, manage the banking, investment and public debt function; and to provide financial and policy analysis to the Treasury Board and Cabinet. The department develops tax policy alternatives; provides economic forecasting, and economic and social statistical data; and annually produces the Budget Speech. It also assists the Government and Legislature with the responsibility of managing and accounting for public monies, and manages the Government's various pension and benefit plans.

Administration (Subvote 1)

Objective

To provide executive direction, leadership and central administration, financial and human resource management, and central computer services to the department.

Program Administration

This program provides executive administration, human resources, financial services, communications, systems support, purchasing, and other general administrative functions. In addition to the Administration Division, this subvote includes the Minister's Office, the Associate Minister's Office and the Deputy Minister's Office.

Provincial Comptroller's Office (Subvote 31)

Objective

To provide assistance to the Legislature and the Government in controlling and accounting for the spending of the public monies

Program Administration

This program provides for the administration of the Government's central expenditure, payroll, and revenue systems and prepares the Government's financial statements and public accounts. The Division also develops accounting, reporting, and financial administrative policy for Treasury Board and audits federal-provincial cost-sharing agreement claims.

Treasury and Debt Management (Subvote 56)

Objective

To arrange the financial requirements of the Government, Crown corporations, and other agencies.

Program Administration

This program provides for the management of the provincial debt and an investment management service for various funds administered by the Government, Crown corporations, and other agencies. The Division manages the cash position of the Consolidated Fund and reports on the guaranteed debt of the Province.

Revenue Division (Subvote 6)

Objective

To administer various Saskatchewan tax and refund programs.

Program Administration

This program provides for the management of certain provincial tax and refund programs. The Division collects revenue, audits businesses and provides information and rulings in accordance with the legislative requirements of the programs.

Budget Analysis Division (Subvote 57)

Objective

To provide financial and policy analysis to the Treasury Board and Cabinet.

Program Administration

This program develops and analyzes revenue, expenditure, economic, and compensation policies to assist Treasury Board and Cabinet in developing and implementing the Government's fiscal plan.

Unforeseen and unprovided for (Subvote 59)

Objective

To provide payments for miscellaneous expenditures for which there is no appropriation of funds.

Program Administration

This program remits payment of dormant court monies deposited to the Consolidated Fund, monies deposited as a result of companies winding up, and other miscellaneous unforeseen payments for which no funds were originally appropriated.

Implementation of guarantees (Statutory) (Subvote 66)

Objective

To make payments as a result of loan guarantees requiring payment.

Program Administration

This program provides funding of loan guarantees requiring implementation.

Bonding of public officials (Subvote 61)

Obiective

To provide all government employees with a security bond.

Program Administration

This program provides payment to the bond issuer that provides insurance for all government employees.

Miscellaneous refunds (Subvote 62)

Objective

To allow for refunds of revenue which represent an improper payment to the Government.

Program Administration

This program refunds revenue which was received in a proceeding fiscal year and which represents an improper payment to the Government.

Remissions under The Financial Administration Act (Subvote 60)

Objective

To provide for the remission of tax, penalties, or interest payable.

Program Administration

This program allows liabilities for tax, penalty, or interest to be waived if it is considered in the public good to do so, or if hardship or injustice would result to the persons required to pay the liability. Remissions under this program are primarily for income tax liabilities.

Remissions under The Revenue and Financial Services Act (Subvote 22)

Objective

To provide for the remission of taxes, penalties, or interest imposed under various revenue collection programs.

Program Administration

This program allows liabilities for tax, penalty, or interest to be waived if it is considered in the public good to do so, or if hardship or injustice would result to the persons required to pay the liability. Remissions under this program are primarily for consumption tax liabilities.

Interest on tax overpayments pursuant to section 56 of The Revenue and Financial Services Act (Statutory) (Subvote 51)

Objective

To provide interest to taxpayers on overpayments of corporation capital tax.

Program Administration

This program ensures that taxpayers who make overpayments of corporation capital tax receive interest on their overpayments.

To provide for expenditures respecting the Saskatchewan Pension Plan (Subvote 53)

Objective

To provide individuals, with little or no access to private pensions or other retirement savings, the opportunity to contribute toward their retirement income.

Program Administration

This program applies to all Saskatchewan residents between the ages of 18 and 65. Members can contribute up to \$600 per year to age 65 and may retire anytime between the ages of 55 and 70. Amendments to *The Saskatchewan Pension Plan Act* resulted in the elimination of the government match for members' contributions to the Plan after May 7, 1992. It also resulted in the elimination of the guaranteed minimum pension, effective August 28, 1992.

Mortgage Protection Plan (Subvote 54)

Objective

To protect Saskatchewan residents from high mortgage interest rates by providing subsidy payments to eligible home owners.

Program Administration

This program applied to home owners with mortgage interest rates above 13.25%. Benefits were provided on a total mortgage amount of up to \$50,000. A home owner's monthly assistance was the difference between the required monthly amount that was payable under the mortgage agreement and the monthly amount that would have been payable based on an interest rate of 13.25%. The program ended June 30, 1992.

Payments under the Provincial Disaster Assistance Program (Subvote 49)

Objective

To provide financial assistance to claimants located in an area that has been declared eligible for assistance as a result of a natural disaster.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance for certain types of uninsurable losses and damage to property. In the case of a local government authority, the loss or damage must be greater than either a 3 mill levy on the taxable assessment of the local government authority or \$1,000,000. In the case of individuals, small businesses, hospitals, schools, and charitable organizations, the total loss in the disaster area must be at least \$25,000, or a single claimant must have at least \$5,000 in uninsurable damage.

Pension Review Task Force (Subvote 15)

Objective

To provide funding to perform a review of public sector pension plans.

Program Administration

This program provides a review on the adequacy of pension benefits, indexing of pension benefits, funding of the unfunded liabilities, the rates of contribution to the plan, governance of the pension plans, the application of *The Pension Benefits Act*, investment of the plan assets, and the administration of the pension plans.

Employer's contribution to the Canada Pension Plan (Subvote 63)

Obiective

To provide the employer's Canada Pension Plan matching contribution for all government employees, with the exception of Crown corporations.

Program Administration

This program provides payment to the Receiver General for Canada for the employer's share of Canada Pension.

Unemployment Insurance — Employer's contribution (Subvote 64)

Obiective

To provide the employer's portion of unemployment insurance contributions for all government employees, with the exception of Crown corporations.

Program Administration

This program provides payment to the Receiver General for Canada for the employer's share of unemployment insurance contributions.

Workers' Compensation Board — Employer's assessment (Subvote 67)

Objective

To provide workers' compensation benefits to all employees of the Provincial Government, with the exception of Crown corporations.

Program Administration

This program provides payment to the Workers' Compensation Board for the cost of premiums to cover all Provincial Government employees against injuries as a result of work

Payments for Public Employees' Benefits — Administration (Subvote 32)

Objective

To account for the administration costs of the Public Service Superannuation Plan.

Program Administration

This program allocates administrative costs of the superannuation plans to the various plans and programs. Costs are billed monthly to the plans for reimbursement.

Payments under the Public Service Superannuation Plan (Statutory) (Subvote 33)

Objective

To provide superannuation allowances to public employees who have retired, and to the dependents of deceased superannuates.

Program Administration

This program administers the daily operation of a number of superannuation plans.

Employer's matching contribution to the Public Employees' (Government Contributory) Superannuation Plan (Statutory) (Subvote 40)

Objective

To provide a matching contribution towards members' superannuation allowances.

Program Administration

This program administers the payment of superannuation allowances to public employees.

Early Retirement Supplement — Public Employees' Superannuation Plan (Subvote 74)

Objective

To provide for benefit payments to early retirees who were members of the Public Employees' Superannuation Plan.

Program Administration

This program administers the payment of superannuation allowances to public employees who were retired early.

Cost of living bonus for superannuates and widows of superannuates (Subvote 34)

Objective

To provide a minimum pension allowance to retired government employees and widows of these employees.

Program Administration

This program provides a cost of living bonus of at least \$100 per month to retired government employees and the widows of these employees.

Employer's assessment for the Disability Income Plan (Subvote 42)

Objective

To provide a level of income protection during periods of occupational or total disability to certain public employees.

Program Administration

The plan is self-insured and is managed by the Public Employees' Benefits Agency. The administration process of adjudicating claims, issuing payments, and claimant status reviews are performed by a private administrator. The Public Employees' Benefits Agency handles inquiries and audits the remittance of associated fees.

Employer's contribution for the Employees' Group Life Insurance Plan (Subvote 43)

Objective

To provide comprehensive life insurance coverage to certain public employees.

Program Administration

Administration services are provided by a private administrator. The Public Employees' Benefits Agency handles inquiries and audits the remittance of associated fees.

Employer's contribution for the Public Employees' Dental Plan (Subvote 44)

Objective

To promote good dental health among public employees by reducing costs for preventive, routing, and major dental services

Program Administration

Claims are adjudicated and processed for payment by a private administrator. The Public Employees' Benefits Agency handles inquiries and audits the remittance of associated fees.

Payments to the Judges of the Provincial Court Superannuation Fund pursuant to subsection 27(3) of The Provincial Court Act (Statutory) (Subvote 41)

Objective

To provide retirement allowances to judges employed by the Province.

Program Administration

This program administers a formula pension plan which provides pensions based on average salary and years of service as a judge or magistrate. Calculations and administration are assigned to the Public Employees' Benefits Agency.

To provide for a net expenditure (recovery) of (from) the Public Employees' Benefits Agency Revolving Fund (Statutory) (Subvote 73)

Objective

To allow for the payment and recovery of the pension and benefits administration costs from participating programs.

Program Administration

The Public Employees' Benefits Agency Revolving Fund administers payments, allocation of costs, and recoverable bill amounts for individual superannuation plans. Revenue generated serves to offset the costs of providing benefits to participating programs. The net expenditure (recovery) for a fiscal year is a charge to the Consolidated Fund.

Minister of Finance's contribution to Members of the Legislative Assembly Superannuation Fund (Statutory)

(Subvote 46)

Objective

To provide a pension to Members of the Legislative Assembly.

Program Administration

This program consists of two pension plans administered by the Public Employees' Benefits Agency: a unit benefit (formula) plan requiring additional funding for superannuation allowances, and a money purchase plan requiring matched contributions.

To provide for payments to the Municipal Employees' Superannuation Fund pursuant to section 46 of The Municipal Employees' Superannuation Act (Subvote 65)

Objective

To provide funding for allowances to superannuated rural secretaries.

Program Administration

This program administers the payments of superannuation allowances to superannuated rural secretaries.

Payments under the Employees Savings Account (Statutory) (Subvote 37)

Objective

To provide a retirement benefit to employees ineligible to contribute to the Public Service Superannuation Plan due to age restrictions.

Program Administration

This program administers the payment of retirement benefits to public employees ineligible to contribute to the Public Service Superannuation Plan due to age restrictions.

Health (Vote 32)

The mandate of the Department is to provide leadership and vision to the health system in order to protect and improve the health and well-being of the people of Saskatchewan. The Department accomplishes its mandate by providing policy direction, direct services, and funding.

General Administration (Subvote 1)

Objective

To provide executive direction, leadership, financial advice, and administrative support services to department programs.

Program Administration

This program provides executive direction, leadership, financial management advice, budget preparation, revenue and expenditure accounting and forecasting, procurement of goods and mail services, space and accommodation services, and development of administrative and management policies; and coordinates departmental activities regarding the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act.

Corporate Information and Technology (Subvote 57)

Objective

To plan, coordinate, and support information systems development and the implementation of computer technology within the department.

Program Administration

This program provides the department with management of an information architecture plan, coordination of systems development, establishment of policies and standards concerning information technology, technical support for computer networks, coordination of all hardware and software acquisitions, and microcomputer user support.

Human Resources and Health Compensation (Subvote 5)

Objective

To provide human resource services to the department, including consultation, staff development, and fee negotiations with professional groups.

Program Administration

This program provides consultative and support services in the areas of employee relations, organization design, classification, compensation, recruitment, employee benefits, and records management. The program also provides a consulting service to assist in resolving management problems; develops a strategy to address corporate staff development priorities, branch and individual needs; and prepares a staff development plan and coordinates and delivers staff development programs. It also delivers the department bursary program and participates with branch managers in the negotiating of professional contracts.

Health Education and Promotion (Subvote 56)

Objective

To deliver information to the public on health policies, programs and services, and health and lifestyle issues; and to provide educational and resource centre support.

Program Administration

This program develops, delivers, and evaluates the department's editorial and paid communications plans and strategies for programs, initiatives, and issues. It provides consulting, administrative support, and delivery of department programs and services including communications plans and strategies for individual programs, community and sponsorship grants, library services for health staff and professionals, distribution of health promotion material and displays, and programs to raise the awareness of community development and its benefits.

Health Planning and Policy Development (Subvote 14)

Objective

To provide health planning and policy development support services within the department.

Program Administration

This program provides activities such as: carrying out health planning studies; supporting health reform activities; coordinating the development of departmental legislation; developing policy proposals concerning human resources in the health sector; providing coordination and analytic service for interprovincial planning processes; and providing related support services to executive management.

Community Health Prevention Services (Subvote 8)

Objective

To promote prevention of diseases and disabilities and to help protect, maintain, and improve people's health by providing community-based health services.

Program Administration

This program provides services such as epidemiological monitoring, public health nursing, public health inspection, nutrition counselling, early childhood psychology, speech and language therapy, and dental health education. These services are delivered at the community level throughout the Province through a network of ten health regions. This program also provides financial assistance in the form of grants to non-government organizations involved in prevention activities.

Community Health Treatment Services (Subvote 4)

Objective

To provide treatment, rehabilitation, and health support services at the community level.

Program Administration

This program provides central direction and coordination of a

variety of community-based programs including physiotherapy and occupational therapy, chiropody, Saskatchewan Aid to Independent Living, and the Saskatchewan Hearing Aid Plan. It also provides funding and direct delivery of physiotherapy, occupational therapy, and chiropody services.

Saskatchewan Hearing Aid Plan (Subvote 11)

Objective

To provide Saskatchewan residents with professional audiological services.

Program Administration

This program provides through clinics: comprehensive hearing testing, counselling and education services, hearing aid fittings and related technical services, repair services and quality aids at reduced costs, loaner aids at no charge, and hearing aids to hearing-impaired preschool children.

Saskatchewan Aid to Independent Living (Subvote 35)

Objective

To provide aids and related services to assist handicapped and disabled residents of Saskatchewan.

Program Administration

This program administers and directs the delivery of a series of universal and extended benefits programs providing the following services to eligible beneficiaries: free loaners, repair and recycle of assorted mobility, environmental, respiratory, and vision aids. It also provides cost coverage of prosthetics, orthotics, home oxygen therapy supplies, non-formulary drugs, medical supplies, incontinence supplies, and specialized rehabilitation equipment.

Vital Statistics and Health Registration (Subvote 15)

Obiective

To register births, marriages, deaths, divorces, adoptions, and name changes; and to maintain a central registry of Saskatchewan residents who are eligible for health care benefits.

Program Administration

This program issues certificates upon application and payment of prescribed fees as legal proof of vital events such as births, marriages, deaths, and name changes. A statistical database is maintained and updated daily, as a central registry of residents who are eligible for health care benefits. Eligible residents are issued plastic health services cards.

Laboratory and Disease Control Services (Subvote 18)

Objective

To detect health threats; to aid in early diagnosis of illness; to permit timely treatment of illnesses; and to diagnose, treat, and prevent tuberculosis.

Program Administration

This program operates laboratories that perform tests on specimens received from hospitals and physicians and on samples collected for environmental monitoring purposes. It also prepares statistics on the incidence of communicable disease. The program distributes vaccines to hospitals, doctors' offices, health regions, and other medical centres. It also manages the Tuberculosis Control Program, including identification, treatment, monitoring, education, and prevention; and provides research and assessment of the adverse and beneficial effects of drugs on the population.

Mental Health Services (Subvote 20)

Objective

To ensure access to a comprehensive range of mental health services.

Program Administration

This program provides mental health professionals for community based mental health services; operates acute care inpatient mental health centres; licenses approved mental health care homes; and funds and coordinates the activities of a variety of organizations which provide mental health services and research.

Medical Care Insurance Administration (Subvote 42)

Objective

To manage the Medical Care Insurance Program, Children's Dental Program and the Supplementary Health Program.

Program Administration

This program administers fee negotiation and consultations with various professional associations; establishes assessment rules and processes payments for claims made under the programs; maintains a comprehensive statistical system used to process claims; accumulates program data; and manages a professional review process.

Hospital and Ambulance Administration (Subvote 43)

Objective

To provide an administrative program and financial support services for hospitals, ambulance services, and health care facility planning.

Program Administration

This program administers the Saskatchewan Hospital Services Plan, including funding for base, regional, large and small community hospitals, the Saskatchewan Cancer Foundation, community clinics, integrated facilities, road and air ambulance services, out-of-province hospital services on behalf of Saskatchewan residents, and other organizations providing related health services.

The program provides direction and assistance to communities in identifying and planning their future health care needs in order to achieve an integrated approach to developing health care facilities.

Prescription Drug Plan Administration (Subvote 44)

Objective

To make prescribed drugs more affordable, while ensuring quality, availability, and therapeutic effectiveness.

Program Administration

This program administers claims processing, policies, and procedures. The pharmacy claims processing network maintains a comprehensive database in order to adjudicate and pay for prescription drug claims; to determine the consumer share of prescription cost at the time of dispensing; to guarantee maximum prices from manufacturers; and to establish maximum wholesale mark-ups, pharmacy mark-ups, and pharmacy dispensing fees. It also develops education programs; prepares quality assurance and quality of care initiatives; provides in-house drug use studies; and conducts research projects with outside agencies.

Continuing Care Administration (Subvote 50)

Objective

To develop and maintain long-term health care services ranging from institutional care to community-based support services provided in the home.

Program Administration

This program administers the Home Care Program, Special-Care Homes Program, and licensing of private care homes. It is responsible for program consultation, monitoring of program standards, development of program initiatives and policies, and providing leadership in managing long-term care.

Northern Health Services (Subvote 47)

Objective

To provide community-based health services to the people of northern Saskatchewan.

Program Administration

This program provides community-based administration and delivery of a variety of health services including primary care, public health nursing, mental health services, physician services, children's dental services, home care, public health inspection, nutrition counselling, speech and language pathology, and health education.

Wellness Programming (Subvote 19)

Objective

To support activities related to the wellness approach to health reform.

Program Administration

This program examines issues and options associated with the implementation of health reform through: consultations with health professionals, consumer groups, and other stakeholders; development of strategies to address health service delivery issues; and establishment of programs and resources to support the health reform process.

Payments to Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation (Subvote 58)

Objective

To manage the administrative services provided to the department by Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation.

Program Administration

This program provides funding to the Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation for delivery of a variety of services which support department operations including office and regional facilities rental, mail services, records management, and other administrative support services.

Grants in support of health services (Subvote 9)

Objective

To support and enhance the delivery of health services at the provincial and local community level with special emphasis on prevention and education.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to local health groups, societies, associations, foundations, health centres, educational organizations, councils, federations, health units, and universities to assist them in providing health related services in the Province.

Grant to the Saskatchewan Alcohol and Drug Abuse Commission (Subvote 27)

Objective

To provide leadership and services in prevention, recovery, community action, and research to reduce alcohol and other drug problems.

Program Administration

This program provides funding for a variety of health services including preventive education and community mobilization, screening and assessment services, addiction/chemical abuse recovery, research, and training. It also provides program and financial administration services. All services are designed to help individuals, families, and communities address problems related to substance abuse.

Payments for Hospital Services (Subvote 29)

Obiective

To fund payments for hospital and other insured health services provided to beneficiaries.

Program Administration

This program provides funding for insured health services to beneficiaries provided by in-province hospitals, community health centres and private practice physiotherapists, out-of-province and out-of-country hospitals, and the Canadian Red Cross Society blood transfusion service and blood fraction products; and grants to various health-related third party agencies.

Grants to Hospitals under The Hospital Revenue Act (Subvote 31)

Obiective

To distribute the hospital revenue tax levies to eligible hospitals.

Program Administration

Hospital revenue tax levies paid by municipalities are distributed to eligible hospitals based on the insured days of services provided to residents of the municipalities which have paid the tax levy.

Grants to Hospitals (Capital) (Subvote 2)

Objective

To provide and manage financial assistance to hospital boards for the construction and renovation of hospitals and integrated facilities.

Program Administration

This program provides funding for the provincial share of approved hospital and integrated facility projects, and oversees the design, construction, and administration aspects of the projects. Approved capital costs may include project administration, consulting, land acquisition, construction, and related costs.

Grants to support the medical education system (Subvote 38)

Objective

To provide financial assistance for clinical services provided through the College of Medicine, University of Saskatchewan by interns, residents, and faculty members.

Program Administration

This program provides funds for post-graduate education salaries for interns and residents providing service in Saskatchewan hospitals, the service component of some faculty members of the College of Medicine, and certain other service related projects associated with medical education.

Grant to the Saskatchewan Cancer Foundation (Subvote 40)

Objective

To provide financial assistance for the development and operation of cancer programs.

Program Administration

This program provides grants to the Saskatchewan Cancer Foundation to support delivery of Saskatchewan's cancer control programs and services, including operation of the Saskatoon Cancer Centre and the Allan Blair Memorial Clinic, operation of the Screening Program for Breast Cancer, maintenance of the Saskatchewan Cancer Registry, and selection and coordination of all cancer-related clinical trials and research. The program also provides training of Radiation Therapy Technologists and grants to health professional organizations for cancer education services.

Grants for health research (Subvote 39)

Objective

To support health research activities within the Province.

Program Administration

This program provides funding to the University of Saskatchewan and the Saskatchewan Cancer Foundation to assist them in carrying out health research for the Province. It also provides funding to the Health Services Utilization Research Commission to review the utilization of health services by Saskatchewan residents, and to administer research grant competitions for the Province.

Grants for mental health services (Subvote 45)

Obiective

To support organizations involved in the delivery of mental health services, mental health awareness promotion, and the training of mental health professionals.

Program Administration

This program provides grants for a variety of mental health related purposes including community based organizations that provide vocational, rehabilitative, and residential services to persons with psychiatric disabilities, psychiatric patient self help groups, and organizations involved in informing the public about the nature of mental illness; and to support professional training in mental health related areas.

Grants and allowances for ambulance services (Subvote 49)

Objective

To ensure access to emergency medical transportation to all Saskatchewan residents.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to emergency medical transporters by funding district ambulance boards and ambulance operators based on an established funding formula; subsidizing road ambulance trips for senior citizens; and funding air transportation costs which are paid by the program and patients are billed a user fee.

Grants and allowances for Home Care (Subvote 53)

Objective

To help individuals remain independent at home by providing acute, palliative, and supportive care to supplement the support provided by the family and community.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to home care districts and other health agencies which provide services for home care health related purposes, including assessment and care coordination, nursing, homemaking, meals, and minor home maintenance required to ensure client safety.

Grants and allowances for Special Care Services (Subvote 54)

Objective

To ensure that appropriate long-term institutional care is available to people who need more care and supervision than is available in their own homes.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance for special-care homes, long term care hospital beds, and for adult day care programs. It also provides funds to agencies responsible for assessing clients for placement in special-care homes in Regina and Saskatoon and to agencies assessing individuals for placement in personal care homes across the Province.

Reform Initiatives (Subvote 25)

Objective

To provide financial assistance to support health district development by communities.

Program Administration

This program provides grants for the support of local planning committee activities related to the health district development process, such as consultations with stakeholders and health providers.

Grants to Special Care Facilities (Capital) (Subvote 10)

Objective

To provide and manage financial assistance to special-care home boards for the construction and renovation of specialcare home facilities.

Program Administration

This program provides funding for the provincial share of approved special-care homes and oversees the design, construction, and administration aspects of the projects. Approved capital costs may include project administration, consulting, land acquisition, construction, and related costs.

Saskatchewan Medical Care Insurance — To provide for a provincial grant (Subvote 28)

Objective

To provide medical care insurance coverage to Saskatchewan residents for services provided by physicians, chiropractors (co-payment), optometrists (children under 18 and Family Income Plan, Saskatchwan Income Plan and Social Assistance Plan recipients), and for certain dental services.

Program Administration

This program provides funding for insured services provided by practitioners, in accordance with established payment schedules, agreements, and assessment rules.

Saskatchewan Prescription Drug Plan — To provide for a provincial grant (Subvote 24)

(Subvote 34)

Objective

To administer a province wide network to process and adjudicate prescription drug claims and to determine the consumer share of prescription cost at the time of dispensing.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance for the processing and payment of prescription drug accounts submitted by participating pharmacies and eligible families.

Payments under the Children's Dental Plan (Subvote 62)

Objective

To improve the dental health of children by funding preventive and treatment services.

Program Administration

This program provides funding to the College of Dental Surgeons for provision of dental services to children ages five to thirteen, inclusive, in southern Saskatchewan. (The Children's Dental Plan for northern Saskatchewan is administered by Northern Health Services.)

A comprehensive scope of preventive and treatment services is embodied in the payment schedule. Dentists in private practice bill the College on a fee-for-service basis.

Payments under the Supplementary Health Services Program (Subvote 63)

Objective

To provide payment for non-insured health services to people nominated for supplementary coverage by the Department of Social Services and other specified groups.

Program Administration

Covered services include medical examinations and reports requested by Social Services, dental treatment, optical services, chiropractor services, non-formulary prescription drugs, most medical supplies and appliances prescribed by physicians which are not provided under other assistance programs, emergency road ambulance, and other medically related transportation in the northern district.

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Highways and Transportation (Vote 16)

The mandate of the Department is to develop transportation policy and to plan, design, construct, maintain, and manage the Province's transportation infrastructure.

Administrative Services (Subvote 1)

Objective

To provide executive leadership and direct the allocation of departmental resources; provide property acquisition and property management services; coordinate the tendering and administration of contracts; coordinate department accommodation; communicate programs, policies and accomplishments; and manage the department's equipment fleet.

Program Administration

This program provides direction for the development and delivery of department programs through consultation with the public, transportation agencies, other jurisdictions, and other government departments, through strategic planning. It provides property related services for various department programs. It establishes tendering acceptance guidelines, executes and administers contracts, and coordinates the department's space requirements with Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation. This program produces the official provincial highway map, and annual report; and provides communications services. It also manages the department's equipment fleet.

Financial Services (Subvote 2)

Objective

To provide financial advice and services to the department programs.

Program Administration

This program provides financial management advice; processes accounts receivable, accounts payable, and payroll; prepares financial reports and statements; coordinates budgets and forecasts; and conducts process reviews to ensure the adequacy of controls and the accuracy of financial information. It also provides inventory administration and prepares briefing material.

Information Services (Subvote 34)

Objective

To promote the effective use of information through provision, planning, management, and support of information technology within the department.

Program Administration

This program provides strategic and operational planning, facilitation of the use of technology by end-users, acquisition of computer related products, management of information resources (setting standards, policies, business modelling), provision and operation of networks and associated facilities, application support and development, and direct end-user support (including training).

Human Resource (Subvote 3)

Obiective

To provide human resource services to the department.

Program Administration

This program provides services in the areas of labour relations, employee services, classification, staffing, industrial relations, and staff development.

Technical Standards and Policies (Subvote 36)

Objective

To define and provide expertise for the standards and policy used in the development and maintenance of the Province's transportation infrastructure; to provide bridge engineering, construction, and maintenance services; to provide central laboratory services; to provide highway surface condition testing; to centralize tendering for major material purchases; to administer the quality assurance programs; and to tender, execute, and administer payment of major contracts.

Program Administration

This program develops policies, standards, and procedures in the following areas: geometric design and traffic engineering, maintenance engineering, pavement design and management, bulk commodity transport, testing, and materials. It provides management and engineering services for the design and construction of new bridges as well as the maintenance and evaluation of existing bridges. It conducts bridge inspections and provides related expertise to other departments and government units. It also provides central laboratory services to the department and pavement surface condition monitoring for management of the system.

Planning and Co-ordination (Subvote 37)

Objective

To provide the operational planning, budgeting and monitoring functions for the delivery of the capital, maintenance, research, and Rural Municipal Revenue sharing programs.

Program Administration

This program is responsible for the development of the long-term and annual highways capital and maintenance programs; the development of the Rural Municipal Revenue Sharing program; the coordination of the annual research program; the management of the department's infrastructure information systems; the administration of the department's Revolving Fund; and the management of the equipment fleet.

Field Services (Subvote 39)

Objective

To administer and manage the department's design, construction, and maintenance programs, and the municipal road and ferry services programs in the districts.

Program Administration

This program provides engineering services in the design and construction of transportation infrastructure, roadway illumination, and safety improvement projects. It also plans, directs and executes the construction of the transportation infrastructure; administers the maintenance and operation of the highway system; provides guidance and advice to the rural municipalities for the rural road system and operates ferry services at major river crossing points.

Rail Transportation (Subvote 44)

Objective

To develop policy, planning, and program initiatives to facilitate effective rail transportation services in Saskatchewan. Rail transportation initiatives enhance the competitiveness of Saskatchewan shippers through reduced freight costs, improved rail services, and increased modal competition. Grain transportation initiatives are developed to meet the needs of producers and rural communities for an integrated and efficient transport system. Coordination services are provided to shippers and carriers for intermodal and multimodal transport issues.

Program Administration

This program provides policy analysis and advisory services to develop and implement provincial and federal rail policy initiatives; policy analysis and consultative services to facilitate the development of an efficient and effective grain handling and transportation system; planning and coordination services to enhance rail transportation services for Saskatchewan shippers; financial analysis of regulated rail costs to minimize producers' freight costs through participation in costing reviews; and intermodal planning and consultative services to enhance regional transportation systems for bulk commodities. It also administers *The Railway Act*, including approval to construct a railway, processes applications for carrier operating authority; and develops and enforces regulations for tariffs, engineering, and operating safety.

Road Transportation (Subvote 45)

Objective

To develop road policies, regulations, and programs for the social and economic benefit of the Province through three main programs: weight and dimension regulations and policies, specialized trucking programs, and road policy development. Services specifically affect shippers and carriers striving to reduce their cost of transportation to remain competitive.

Program Administration

This program works closely with industry to identify barriers to an efficient and effective transportation system. It is responsible for examining total costs and benefits for industry and government along with impacts to other road users. It is also responsible for regulatory changes, policy decisions, and new trucking programs or agreements on highway upgrading projects.

Transportation and Economic Development (Subvote 46)

Objective

To develop strategic policies and programs to ensure optimal provision of inter-city passenger and freight services in Saskatchewan.

Program Administration

This program provides consultative, advisory, and regulatory services.

Aviation and Northern Transportation (Subvote 47)

Objective

To enhance and support social and economic development opportunities for Saskatchewan by providing services related to aviation, airports, northern transportation, and the environment.

Program Administration

This program is responsible for the development of programs and policies for aviation, community airports, and northern transportation including planning for provincial airports, road, and marine transportation. It is also responsible for developing and coordinating the department's environmental policy and planning activities.

Regulation and Traffic Safety (Subvote 48)

Objective

To provide motor vehicle safety and transportation services and to develop and implement transportation regulations.

Program Administration

This program develops motor vehicle policies in the areas of vehicle use, taxation, legislation, and safety. It plans and manages activities for the Highway Traffic Board. It also issues permits for fuel tax, vehicle registration, overweight and over dimension vehicles, and special uses; processes truck and bus applications to carry goods and passengers; and operates the department's inquiry line.

Compliance and Enforcement (Subvote 49)

Objective

To provide enforcement of motor transport laws and regulations covering vehicle and driver safety, weights and dimensions, and economic regulation (operating authority and registration).

Program Administration

This program conducts truck and bus inspections at road side and at 14 permanent inspection stations (weigh scales). Investigators perform audits of carrier facilities as well as investigate complaints of carrier misconduct. It also assumes responsibility for special agreement compliance issues.

Rural Surface Transportation (Capital) (Subvote 55)

Objective

To construct and rehabilitate provincial highways.

Program Administration

This program upgrades existing roadways to higher design standards, rebuilds deteriorated highways, restores and strengthens pavement by resurfacing, and repairs and modifies (widens and/or raises) bridges.

Air Transportation (Capital) (Subvote 57)

Objective

To provide access to remote northern communities; to provide facilities for forest fire fighting services and for improving, maintaining and operating local airports.

Program Administration

This program provides funding assistance for the development, operation, and maintenance of community airports, and upgrades department airports.

Maintenance of Highways and Transportation Facilities (Subvote 8)

Objective

To preserve, restore, and operate the provincial transportation infrastructure to ensure quality of service and planned life is achieved.

Program Administration

This program provides maintenance of the road surface and right of way, snow and ice control, and guidance and warning for motorists; and prevents avoidable deterioration of the physical plant to ensure safe and comfortable use.

To provide for a net expenditure (recovery) of (from) the Highways Revolving Fund (Statutory) (Subvote 23)

Objective

To purchase and maintain the department's equipment fleet and to maintain inventories of repair parts and items used to maintain provincial highways.

Program Administration

This program provides procurement services for equipment used in the maintenance of highways. Eight shop locations throughout the Province maintain inventories of materials and repair parts and provide repair services for department owned equipment. This program also performs public improvement custom work for municipalities, other provincial and federal government departments, Crown corporations and, in some instances, individuals, partnerships, and associations.

Grants to Traffic Safety and Transportation Associations (Subvote 22)

Objective

To support non-profit research and development and safety organizations which pertain to the field of transportation.

Program Administration

This program provides funding for certain transportation and safety organizations which conduct studies for the improvement of transportation in western Canada; furthers the development of all modes of national transportation facilities; and provides a variety of services in the area of safety in transportation.

Indian and Metis Affairs Secretariat (Vote 25)

Indian and Metis Affairs (Subvote 1)

Objective

To promote and facilitate partnerships between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal peoples in achieving common goals and enhancing quality of life.

Program Administration

The Secretariat serves as the "window" into government for Indian and Metis peoples, coordinates policies, administers grant programs, and manages provincial obligations under Treaty Land Entitlement Agreements.

Grants under the Indian Economic Development Program (Subvote 4)

Objective

To enable Indian people to become more economically selfsufficient through the establishment of viable businesses.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance for the development and expansion of business ventures owned and controlled by Indian people.

Grants under the Metis Business Development Program (Subvote 5)

Objective

To enable Metis people to become more economically selfsufficient through the establishment of viable businesses.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance for the development and expansion of business ventures owned and controlled by Metis people.

Grants to Indian and Metis Organizations (Subvote 2)

Objective

To enable Aboriginal organizations to undertake projects and activities in support of their respective memberships.

Program Administration

This program provides financial support to Aboriginal organizations in order to carry out priority projects such as Metis enumeration, tripartite processes, and women's initiatives.

Grants to Indian and Metis Public Authorities (Subvote 8)

Objective

To provide for rationalized and accountable Aboriginal programs and services.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to facilitate the development of Aboriginal service delivery institutions, at the community level, which provide culturally appropriate, rationalized, and accountable services.

Native Career Development Program and Training and Employment Projects (Subvote 6)

Obiective

To facilitate greater employment opportunities for Aboriginal peoples across the public and private sectors.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to Aboriginal educational institutions and employers to strategically link potential employers with suitable Aboriginal candidates through development of an Aboriginal inventory, support services, and "cross-cultural" awareness.

Treaty Land Entitlement (Subvote 9)

Objective

To coordinate provincial obligations in implementing treaty land entitlement agreements.

Program Administration

This program administers the provincial share of the costs and other obligations regarding treaty land entitlements pursuant to agreements with the federal government and bands.

Justice (Vote 3)

The Department's mandate is to maintain public order and safety through the operation of an independent, impariial, and effective justice system which upholds the rule of law and defines and protects the basic legal rights of our citizens.

Administrative Services (Subvote 1)

Objective

To provide central support services to the department, the boards and commissions assigned to the Minister of Justice, and the Office of the Lieutenant Governor.

Program Administration

This program provides the following services: budget preparation, revenue and expenditure accounting, financial management advice, internal audit, procurement of goods, mail services, and accommodation; personnel administration, payroll, labour relations, and staff recruitment and development; computer systems review, development, implementation, and maintenance; and support resources for all communication needs.

It also provides program delivery in the following area: coordination/implementation of the freedom of information legislation.

Civil Law (Subvote 2)

Objective

To provide legal services to all government departments, agencies, boards and commissions.

Program Administration

This program provides the following legal services: acts as counsel in lawsuits against the Crown; prepares legal documents such as consulting and personal service agreements, commercial agreements, land transfers, releases, bonds, guarantees, building contracts, and assignments. It prepares legal opinions respecting interpretations of legislative provisions, Crown liability as a result of government activities, and civil legal problems arising out of government programs; participates in policy development for client agencies; assists in the preparation of drafting instructions, new legislation, and amendments to statutes; and prepares reports for the Minister of Justice and other members of Executive Council.

Public Law and Policy (Subvote 4)

Objective

To assist the Minister of Justice and Attorney General in fulfilling his/her constitutional, statutory, and Cabinet responsibilities by providing both legal and policy advice, and litigation services.

Program Administration

This program provides legal and policy advice on constitutional matters as well as aboriginal, human rights, and trade law issues; supplies coordination and analytical services for the development of all legal and legislative policy; provides technical advice on proposed legislation to departments and government agencies; drafts all Bills and regulations; and

provides strategic planning, policy analysis, program development, and program analysis, especially in the areas of criminal and family law.

Court Services (Subvote 3)

Objective

To provide the support systems required for the just, equitable, and efficient resolution of legal disputes of individuals and/or the Crown.

Program Administration

This program provides staff, courtrooms, document processing and filing, enforcement mechanisms, and statistical data for the Court of Appeal, the Court of Queen's Bench and the Provincial Court.

It also provides support services and/or administers Commissioners for Oaths, Notary Publics, Marriage Commissioners, Justices of the Peace and the Maintenance Enforcement Office.

Salaries of Chief Judge and Provincial Court Judges (Subvote 28)

Objective

To provide for the salaries of the Chief Judge of the Provincial Court, the judges of the Provincial Court, the Traffic Safety Court, Justices of the Peace, and the Supervising Justice of the Peace, in order to support systems required for the just, equitable, and efficient resolution of legal disputes of individuals and/or the Crown.

Salaries of Surrogate Court Judges (Statutory) (Subvote 12)

Objective

To provide payment to judges and supernumerary judges of the Court of Appeal and the Court of Queen's Bench in order to support systems required for the just, equitable, and efficient resolution of legal disputes of individuals and/or the Crown.

Public Prosecutions (Subvote 6)

Objective

To prosecute all criminal code and young offenders in all the courts in the Province and in the Supreme Court of Canada.

Program Administration

This program advises the Attorney General/the Minister of Justice and their respective deputies on all matters pertaining to the administration of criminal justice in the Province. It also provides legal advice to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police in its provincial policing role and to municipal police forces in the Province, and assists them in police training and in specialized training involving changes in the criminal law. It also consults on new federal/provincial legislation or amendments affecting the practice of criminal law.

Policing Services (Subvote 30)

Objective

To provide public security and safety through effective policing service, firearms control, and supervision of the private security industry.

Program Administration

This program administers the Royal Canadian Mounted Police contracts and budgets to provide provincial, aboriginal, and municipal policing services. It develops and implements appropriate policing policy; is responsible for liaising between the Government and the police community; and operates the Firearms Control Program in cooperation with the federal government and the Saskatchewan police community.

Registration of Land Titles (Subvote 8)

Obiective

To provide and administer a system of registration for real property that protects the owner's interest and facilitates property transactions.

Program Administration

This program provides for provincially guaranteed ownership of land and the recording of documents which create interests in land, such as mortgages and easements, in order to protect the person's entitlement to those interests. It also examines and registers land related documents; issues and updates titles; provides title and document searches; maintains perpetual records of titles; provides copies of documents as required; and examines and approves registration of all survey plans, except roadway plans.

Personal Property Registry (Subvote 29)

Objective

To provide a notice filing system where a secured party may register a financing statement indicating an interest in the personal property of a debtor.

Program Administration

This program maintains a record of various types of registrations, registered against personal property in Saskatchewan. It also provides an enquiry system where a person intending to purchase or lend money on the security of personal property can request a search of available information registered against an individual, business, motor vehicle, mobile house, trailer, or airplane. It also operates a service which allows major users of the system to establish a deposit account with the registry and to telephone search requests directly to the registry.

Public Trustee (Subvote 14)

Objective

To administer the property of those persons who are legally incapable of handling their own financial affairs.

Program Administration

This program administers dependent adults' property by management and investment of assets, provision for maintenance and comforts, and maintaining or defending any legal action. This program also protects the property of infants by acting as trustee of trust funds, monitoring claims for

personal injuries or death, and maintaining or defending legal action on property matters. It also oversees activities of official administrators by making recommendations for appointments, reviewing estate administration, and handling collections of escheat monies.

Administration of The Coroners Act (Subvote 25)

Objective

To investigate all accidental and unnatural deaths, and to make recommendations to prevent similar deaths.

Program Administration

This program administers a province wide system of coroners to conduct investigations, make recommendations to appropriate authorities, and hold inquests where public hearings are required.

Saskatchewan Human Rights Commission (Subvote 17)

Objective

To promote recognition of the inherent dignity and the equal inalienable rights of all members of the human family.

Program Administration

This program promotes that every person is free and equal in dignity and rights, and strives to discourage and eliminate discrimination by investigating, settling, and taking to boards of enquiry, various complaints of discrimination; conducting public education activities and promoting, approving and monitoring affirmative action programs in Saskatchewan. Target groups for affirmative action programs are women in management and in non-traditional jobs, persons of Indian ancestry, and disabled persons.

Saskatchewan Police Commission (Subvote 19)

Objective

To promote the preservation of peace, the prevention of crime, and the efficiency of police services; and to improve police relationships with the communities in the Province.

Program Administration

This program provides regulations on police training and service standardization; conducts inquiries into matters relating to policing standards and the conduct or performance of municipal and Royal Canadian Mounted Police force members; and hears and determines appeals against disciplinary penalties or dismissals imposed or ordered by Chiefs of Police, Board of Police Commissioners and Councils. The Commission operates the Police College which provides training for all municipal police departments in the Province.

Public Accounts, 1992-93

Payments to municipalities for the administration of firearms acquisition certificates and firearms and ammunition business permits (Subvote 33)

Objective

To enhance public security by controlling the sale, acquisition, and carrying of firearms.

Program Administration

This program administers and oversees the firearms control program in cooperation with the police. Municipal police forces are reimbursed, for conducting firearms business inspections and issuing permits and licences, by the Province, which is in turn, reimbursed by the federal government.

Adult Corrections (Subvote 35)

Objective

To develop and administer a wide range of control and custody programs, both in the community and institutions; to contain the risk presented to the community by offenders; and to advise and involve the community in the correctional process.

Program Administration

This program provides essential information to the courts; develops and administers non-incarceration sentencing and pre-trial alternatives; and provides opportunities for selected offenders to participate in community activities which promote responsible social behaviour and work patterns after their release, and make reparation to the victim or community. The program also offers a wide range of institutional services including academic and vocational training, counselling services, work, recreational and community service programs, addiction education, and medical and dental services. The program further involves local communities in the provision of community-based correctional services.

Surface Rights Arbitration Board (Subvote 46)

Objective

To settle disputes, between the landowner and/or occupant and the mineral operator, as apply to the surface of the land.

Program Administration

This program acts on the request of the landowner, occupant, or operator of the mineral lease in providing a comprehensive procedure for acquiring surface rights by mineral operators and for compensating for the loss of these rights by the landowner. It also settles disputes which may include entry onto the land for well-sites and access roadways or flow line/service line construction, compensation, rental reviews, damage claims, trespass claims, and reclamation upon abandonment.

Office of the Complaints Investigator (Subvote 57)

Objective

To provide for the investigation and resolution of complaints against municipal police services.

Program Administration

The Complaints Investigator is an independent non-police person appointed by the government to oversee and administer all public complaints against the police. The office ensures that both the public and police are guaranteed a fair and thorough investigation of a complaint.

Provincial Mediation Board (Subvote 50)

Objective

To resolve financial and other disputes between landlords and tenants, debtors and creditors, municipalities and property owners, or mortgagors and mortgagees.

Program Administration

The board resolves disputes by conducting investigations and providing mediation, counselling services, and hearings; and makes decisions where appropriate.

Saskatchewan Farm Security Programs (Subvote 53)

Objective

To provide security for farmers with respect to foreclosure actions and home quarter protection; and to ensure that residents or corporations engaged in farming will own the majority of Saskatchewan agricultural lands.

Program Administration

The Board monitors intended foreclosures, assists during a mediation period, and prepares a report to the court if mediation is unsuccessful. The Board also administers home quarter protection rules and determines if it is in the best interest of the farmer to relinquish protection against foreclosure. In the area of farm ownership, activities include: monitoring and investigating transfers of land to non-residents and non-agricultural corporations; administering hearings for applications under *The Saskatchewan Farm Security Act*; issuing Orders of Divestment; and recommending prosecutions for violations of the Act.

Mediation Services (Subvote 11)

Objective

To provide and encourage the provision of mediation services to the general public for a fee.

Program Administration

This program provides trained mediators to assist farmers and lenders in resolving disputes outside the court system and to assist individuals who request mediation services in resolving family law disputes such as custody, parenting arrangements, and child/spousal support.

Saskatchewan Securities Commission (Subvote 49)

Objective

To protect Saskatchewan investors by regulating the sale of securities.

Program Administration

Rules are aimed at ensuring the honesty and competence of those who sell securities such as shares, bonds, and other types of investments. Rules also require proper disclosure about securities being sold. The Commission enforces these rules and holds to account those who breech them, in an effort to maintain the integrity of the market place. It also provides information and education to investors so they can make informed investment decisions, and informs and educates sellers and issuers of securities enabling them to deal properly with investors.

Consumer Protection (Subvote 16)

Objective

To promote fairness and responsibility between business and consumers, and to ensure financial institutions are able to meet their obligations to clients.

Program Administration

This program's activities include: licensing, auditing, and acting as liaison with directors of financial institutions; mediating consumer complaints between buyers and sellers; administering several licensing and enforcement areas; investigating complaints of non-compliance; and over-seeing three self-administered bodies responsible for insurance brokers, real estate brokers, and funeral homes and services.

Film Classification (Subvote 20)

Objective

To classify all films (motion pictures) intended for public viewing and all video cassettes rented or sold through retail outlets in Saskatchewan.

Program Administration

This program's activities include: making catalogues available to registered video outlets; sending a monthly listing of new films classified to registered movie theatres; reviewing theatre advertisements; sending classification information to theatres; conducting field visits throughout the Province to evaluate effectiveness; and sending informational posters, fax sheets, and brochures to film and video businesses.

Corporations (Subvote 21)

Objective

To provide a registry service for businesses, organizations, and names as required by various legislation.

Program Administration

The branch incorporates Saskatchewan based business and non-profit corporations; registers extra-provincial business and non-profit corporations enabling them to conduct business in Saskatchewan; registers business names of proprietorships and partnerships; maintains membership lists and bylaws of professional associations; maintains a registry of cooperatives and credit unions; and provides access to the public for all of the above information.

Expenses of the Office of the Lieutenant Governor (Subvote 24)

(Transfered to Provincial Secretary, October 1, 1992)

Objective

To represent Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in Saskatchewan and as such exercise the Queen's powers as Head of State within provincial jurisdiction.

Program Administration

As the chief executive officer in the Province, the Lieutenant Governor summons and dissolves the Legislature; recalls its members and prorogues its sessions; formally names the Premier and swears in the Cabinet; reads the speech from the Throne; gives Royal Assent to Bills; and signs provincial proclamations, Letters Patent and orders-in-council. In Saskatchewan, the Lieutenant Governor is Chancellor of the Saskatchewan Order of Merit. The Lieutenant Governor lends patronage to the arts and volunteer organizations, visits schools, makes speeches to various organizations, and presents medals and awards.

To provide for a net expenditure (recovery) of (from) the Queen's Printer Revolving Fund (Statutory) (Subvote 13)

Objective

To publish and distribute Acts, regulations, *The Saskatchewan Gazette*, and other government publications to various government and non-government clients.

Program Administration

The Queen's Printer Revolving Fund publishes statutes in pamphlet, hardcover, and looseleaf form; arranges for the publication of regulations in *The Saskatchewan Gazette*; and publishes regulations in looseleaf form. Publications are sold through the mail and over-the-counter, as well as by annual subscriptions. Revenues earned are retained by the Fund to cover associated expenses. The net cash expenditure (recovery) for a fiscal year is a charge to the Consolidated Fund.

To provide an operating subsidy to the Correctional Facilities Industries Revolving Fund (Subvote 56)

Objective

To provide additional funds to the revolving fund, by way of a subsidy from the department, to allow the Fund to continue to operate.

Program Administration

The Correctional Facilities Industries Revolving Fund provides job skill training by employing inmates in the production of various goods for government departments, Crown corporations, and private sector clients. Examples of products include: office furniture, vehicle repairs, upholstery, and cloth diapers. Revenue generated is retained by the Fund and serves to offset the costs of incarceration of the inmates. Any excess profits are returned to the Consolidated Fund.

To provide for a net expenditure (recovery) of (from) the Correctional Facilities Industries Revolving Fund (Statutory) (Subvote 15)

Objective

To operate a commercial manufacturing and service industry within the correctional centres, providing products to both the private and public sectors.

Program Administration

The Correctional Facilities Industries Revolving Fund provides job skill training by employing inmates in the production of various goods for government departments, Crown corporations and private sector clients. Examples of products include: office furniture, vehicle repairs, upholstery, and cloth diapers. Revenue generated is retained by the Fund and serves to offset the costs of incarceration of the inmates. The net cash expenditure (recovery) for a fiscal year is a charge to the Consolidated Fund.

To provide for Provincial policing services (Subvote 7)

Objective

To provide a provincial policing service.

Program Administration

The Royal Canadian Mounted Police provide policing services, under contract, to all urban municipalities under 500 population, Indian Reserves, rural municipalities, and the Northern Administration District.

Grants to justice organizations and for justice related activities (Subvote 31)

Objective

To provide grants to various justice related organizations.

Program Administration

The organizations receiving grants all fulfil roles independent of the Department of Justice and as such each operates autonomously, without any administrative support or guidance from the department, other than the financial assistance of the grant.

Grant to the Law Reform Commission of Saskatchewan (Subvote 18)

Objective

To review provincial law with a general view towards its simplification and modernization.

Program Administration

This program provides a review process of provincial laws requiring simplification or modernization. Topics may originate from a recommendation of the Minister of Justice, the Commission's staff, the judiciary, the legal professional, other professional organizations, or the general public. The Commission also assesses criticisms of a significant nature from the general public concerning legislation and rules of the common law.

Grants under The Cemeteries Act to cemetery companies in default

(Subvote 23)

Objective

To provide financial assistance to insolvent government owned commercial cemeteries for operational purposes.

Program Administration

The grant allows for the operation of insolvent cemeteries by the provincial government. The funding covers all day-to-day expenses of operating these cemeteries such as ground maintenance, burials, and general administration.

To provide payments for compensation, legal and administration expenses due to the failure of Associated Investors of Canada and First Investors Corporation (Subvote 55)

Objective

To provide funding to enable a settlement offer to be made to Saskatchewan residents who were contract holders of Associated Investors of Canada (AIC) and First Investors Corporation (FIC).

Program Administration

A settlement offer was made to investors during the 1992/93 fiscal year. Approximately 6,900 Saskatchewan investors accepted the offer and received payments from the Province of Saskatchewan. A small portion of the funding covers the legal and administrative expenses associated with coordinating the settlement offer.

To provide for claims pursuant to *The*Land Titles Act (Statutory) (Subvote 5)

Objective

To provide funding to enable the settlement of claims or the payment of judgements for loss or damage arising from an error or omission by, or the operation of, the land titles system.

Program Administration

Claims are made to the Master of Titles and if they are found to be valid, or a judgement has been obtained, settlement is made from this statutory subvote. These claims were funded through The Land Titles Assurance Fund until December 1, 1992.

Labour (Vote 20)

The mandate of the Department is to regulate and promote fairness and equity in Saskatchewan workplaces. In cooperation with working people, unions, employers and other organizations, the Department: establishes the legislative framework for labour relations; promotes, develops, and enforces occupational health and safety and labour standards; assists in preventing and resolving workplace disputes; and advances policies and programs to support labour market adjustment and injured workers.

Administrative Services (Subvote 17)

Objective

To provide executive administration to the Department of Labour, and support services to the Department, the Labour Relations Board, the Women's Secretariat and the Indian and Métis Affairs Secretariat.

Program Administration

This program provides administrative support services in the areas of human resources management and development, communications, financial planning and information systems, accounting and administrative services, and computer systems.

The Employment Equity Unit identifies and eliminates barriers to equal opportunities and implements special measures to increase the number of women, persons of Aboriginal ancestry, and persons with disabilities in the public service by developing policies, educating, advising, collecting statistics, evaluating, and monitoring.

Labour Relations (Subvote 2)

Objective

To promote an informed, productive, and harmonious work environment.

Program Administration

This program provides advisory services and research expertise on employment legislative initiatives and information on Saskatchewan's labour market, working conditions, and collective bargaining to employers, employees, trade unions, the public, and other government departments. It also provides conciliation services to assist employers and unions in resolving disputes arising out of the collective bargaining process, and assistance and advice to injured workers and their dependants who have difficult claims before the Saskatchewan Workers' Compensation Board.

Employment Opportunities (Subvote 23)

Objective

To promote and enhance employment opportunities for Saskatchewan people, in particular persons of Aboriginal ancestry, women, youth, and persons with disabilities.

Program Administration

This program facilitates hiring Saskatchewan residents, especially target group members, on major construction projects; develops and coordinates provincial employment initiatives; provides career information materials and takes part in inter-departmental and inter-governmental forums dealing

with labour market matters; and coordinates public service employment equity programs.

Labour Relations Board (Subvote 14)

Objective

To promote a responsive, simpler, and more cost-efficient alternative to the court system for disputes arising between trade unions and employers.

Program Administration

This program provides an independent, quasi-judicial tribunal when disputes arise between trade unions and employers. The board operates through public hearings followed by written decisions. Its decisions are final and binding upon the parties. There is no appeal, and review by the courts is strictly limited.

Labour Standards (Subvote 18)

Objective

To promote and enforce effective labour standards for employees in Saskatchewan.

Program Administration

This program promotes fair treatment of employees in the workplace, and includes: investigation of complaints related to holidays, hours of work, working conditions, and wages; collection of wages found owing; establishment of hearings to resolve disputes; information to employers and employees of their statutory employment obligations and rights; and promotion and awareness initiatives associated with labour standards.

Pension Benefits (Subvote 8)

Objective

To regulate pension plans and protect pension plan members in the context of encouraging suitable and adequate retirement income plans.

Program Administration

This program establishes and enforces standards on the funding, investment, and management of all private plans in the Province; advises government about retirement income matters; consults with interest groups on pension issues; and distributes informational and educational materials.

Occupational Health (Subvote 10)

Objective

To promote and enforce a safe and healthy working environment for workers in all occupations.

Program Administration

This program promotes maintenance of a safe work environment and a healthy workforce by: preventing work-related accidents by working closely with employers and employers; and promoting occupational health and safety through education, training, inspections, accident

investigations, and enforcement of minimum standards of health and safety.

Disabilities Directorate (Subvote 38)

Objective

To encourage independence and community integration of all persons with disabilities.

Program Administration

This program provides employment access to government for persons with disabilities through information and referral; maintains an inventory of disabled persons seeking employment with the Province; reviews and develops policies regarding disability issues for government; liaises with provincial and federal government departments and community groups; and provides education and awareness to the public about disability issues.

Immigration Services (Subvote 3)

Objective

To develop and coordinate provincial immigration policies and activities which promote increased immigration and successful settlement of immigrants.

Program Administration

This program undertakes targeted promotional programs to attract key immigrants; consults with immigrant serving agencies to assist new residents with settlement and successful integration; negotiates and monitors implementation of the Federal/Provincial Immigration Agreement and the Immigrant Settlement Support Program.

Saskatchewan Partnerships '92 Student Employment Program (Subvote 35)

Obiective

To create student summer employment which allows them to gain practical experience and finance their continuing education.

Program Administration

This program provides grants to employers who provide fulltime summer jobs lasting 300 hours or 400 hours. Eligible employers include businesses, farms, regional parks, municipal governments, and non-profit organizations. Postsecondary students and graduating Grade 12 students, who are 16 or older, are eligible to participate. All students hired under the program must be continuing their education the following school year.

Additional assistance is available to help fund renovation or technical devices required for employers to hire students with disabilities.

Legislation (Vote 21)

The Department's mandate is to provide support services to the Province's elected representatives and the Legislative Assembly and its committees; and to inform the public of the Legislature's activities.

Legislative Assembly Office (Subvote 1)

Objective

To provide procedural, operational, administrative, and financial services to enable Members, committees, and the House itself to perform their functions; and to inform the public of the Legislature's activities.

Program Administration

This program provides support services for legislative activities and individual Members including financial, administrative, human resource, security, and visitor services. It also provides coordination, procedural, protocol, and sessional services; and public information services through television broadcasting, verbatim reports, legislative publications, and educational material.

Legislative Library (Subvote 6)

Objective

To provide parliamentary library services to the Legislative Assembly and provide limited access to collection and reference services to government employees and the public.

Program Administration

This program acquires, catalogues, and provides access to information resources to support the work of the Legislature and the elected Members. The program organizes and preserves its historic collections, and functions as official exchange library and legal deposit library for Saskatchewan government publications. As the largest research collection directly available to the civil service, it cooperates with government libraries and provides access to the collection to government departments and agencies without departmental libraries, and provides limited services to the public.

Legislative Counsel and Law Clerk (Subvote 5)

Objective

To provide all Members of the Legislative Assembly with confidential, in-house legislative legal services.

Program Administration

This program provides non-partisan legislative legal and informational services which include: the drafting of various Bills and House amendments to Bills; compiling and editing the separate chapter Acts and the sessional volume of the Statutes of Saskatchewan; rendering considered legal opinions as required; interpreting legislation and regulations; advising on matters sub judice; attending meetings of various Legislative Committees to advise the Clerk and the Chair; and coordinating the engagement of "outside" counsel as required.

Grants to the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association and Society of Clerks (Subvote 17)

Objective

To provide financial assistance to the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association and Society of Clerks.

Program Administration

This program provides funding to the provincial branch of the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association which provides Members with opportunities for procedural and policy exchanges with elected officials from other parliaments in Canada and throughout the world. It also provides grants to the branch, regional, and international levels of these organizations which have as their aim the promotion and study of parliamentary democracy and the fostering of cooperation and understanding between Commonwealth parliamentarians.

Indemnity, allowances and expenses to Members (Statutory) (Subvote 2)

Obiective

To provide remuneration and expense allowance funds to Members of the Legislative Assembly to enable them to fulfill their role as representatives of the citizens of Saskatchewan.

Program Administration

This program administers all payments to Members in their role as an MLA, including salary, per diem and constituency expense allowance payments. It also interprets policy decisions, maintains payroll and expense allowance statements, and processes payments.

Allowances to the Speaker, Deputy Speaker, Deputy Chairman of Committees, Chairmen of Standing Committees, Opposition House Leader, Whips, and allowances and expenses of the Members of the Board of Internal Economy (Statutory) (Subvote 3)

Objective

To provide remuneration to Members who perform additional duties within the Legislative Assembly, and expense allowance funds for the Board of Internal Economy.

Program Administration

This program processes payments for Members with additional duties relating to the day-to-day operations of the House, for the Speaker to carry out his duties as permanent head of the Legislative Assembly, and for the Board of Internal Economy, the all-party group of Members responsible for the general administration of the Legislative Assembly.

Leader of the Opposition (Statutory) (Subvote 22)

Objective

To provide remuneration to the Member who has the additional responsibility of being the Leader of the Official Opposition.

Program Administration

This program processes payment of the salary of the Leader of the Opposition, as determined by statute, paid on a monthly basis to the Member serving in that capacity.

Office of the Leader of the Opposition - Grant (Statutory) (Subvote 21)

Obiective

To provide funding to cover the cost of staff, supplies, stationery, and services for the operation of the Office of the Leader of the Official Opposition of the Legislative Assembly.

Program Administration

This program provides a grant, authorized in statute, with the amount determined by the Board of Internal Economy. The annual amount is prorated and paid monthly in arrears, to the party designated as the official opposition. The grant funds are administered by staff of that office and are used to provide staff, supplies, stationery, and services necessary for the Leader of the Opposition to perform his duties.

Allowances to caucuses for sessional research, general expenses and secretarial services (Statutory)

(Subvote 20)

Objective

To provide funding to each caucus of the Legislative Assembly and any independent Members, for research, general expenses and secretarial services.

Program Administration

This program provides an annual grant, authorized in statute, to each caucus and independent Member. The grant amount is approved by the Board of Internal Economy and based on a formula that considers the number of private Members in each caucus, plus a lump sum amount for general expenses and secretarial services. The annual grant, prorated and paid monthly in arrears to each caucus, is administered by the caucus for research staff expenses, secretarial services, and general office expenses.

Allowances to caucuses for research (Statutory) (Subvote 23)

Objective

To provide funding for research support for each caucus of the Legislative Assembly.

Program Administration

This program provides an annual grant, authorized in statute, to each caucus. Funding is approved by the Board of Internal Economy and based on a formula that considers the number of private Members in each caucus. The annual amount is prorated and paid monthly, in arrears, to each caucus. The caucus can direct the funds to be used to pay research staff placed on payroll or it can receive the monthly grant as a lump-sum payment each month, to be administered by caucus staff.

Expenses of committees of the Legislature (Statutory) (Subvote 7)

Objective

To provide for the expenses of Members in their role as members of standing, select, and special committees of the Legislative Assembly.

Program Administration

This program provides for per diems and expense payments for Members who serve on all-party legislative committees during a period when the House is not in session. These payments are made in accordance with a directive authorized by the Board of Internal Economy.

Ombudsman (Subvote 8)

Obiective

To assist residents of Saskatchewan by responding to and investigating complaints about decisions of the provincial government departments and agencies, and where appropriate make recommendations for corrective action.

Program Administration

This program responds to all incoming phone calls and correspondence; provides appropriate advice and referrals regarding non-government or premature complaints; meets with complainants and government officials to determine if complaints are substantiated; and provides formal recommendations to department heads to correct errors and remedy injustices.

Office of the Freedom of Information and Privacy Commissioner (Subvote 4)

Objective

To review government decisions under *The Freedom of Information and Privacy Act* to ensure Saskatchewan residents have equal access to records held or controlled by the government.

Program Administration

This program assists individuals, groups, or agencies who have been denied access to a record or part of a record that they have requested under *The Freedom of Information Act*. The Freedom of Information Commissioner reviews decisions by the government to refuse the applications, and rules on whether this decision falls within the guidelines of the Act.

Public Accounts, 1992-93

Natural Resources (Vote 26)

The Department's mandate is to protect and enhance fish, wildlife, and forests to ensure their perpetual supply and biological diversity; to establish and manage a system of parks and protected areas for public enjoyment and education, and preservation of natural and cultural heritage; to manage the use and allocation of resource land in a manner that recognizes public access and resource conservation; to maximize economic and social benefits from resources and programs while maintaining resource sustainability; to manage the department's human, fiscal, and material resources wisely; to educate the public about natural and heritage resources that the department manages.

Executive Administration (Subvote 1)

Obiective

To provide executive direction and leadership on government and department policy, plans, and decisions.

Program Administration

This program provides funding for the operations of the Minister's office, Deputy Minister, division heads, and support staff

Management Services (Subvote 2)

Objective

To provide administrative and human resource support for department programs.

Program Administration

This program provides corporate planning, accounting and payroll, budget preparation and analysis, information systems, financial audits, property management, staffing, classification, staff development, employee relations, occupational health and safety, and employee benefits.

Communications (Subvote 39)

Obiective

To develop communications and public relations programs that foster awareness and understanding, and support department programs, policies and procedures.

Program Administration

This program designs and delivers communications strategies to support individual programs and initiatives; liaises with program areas and the media to arrange interviews and news conferences; researches, writes, and coordinates public affairs requirements for news releases, speeches, articles, brochures, and other written communications; and designs, develops, and implements advertising strategies.

Parks (Subvote 40)

Objective

To ensure planning, policy, and program development and implementation for all park lands; and to facilitate recreation use on Crown land.

Program Administration

This program interacts with the public through consultation and surveys to help develop future park plans; determines needs of the current park system; and ensures the public has high quality and varied facilities available while using the parks.

Resource Lands (Subvote 48)

Objective

To administer Crown resource lands, legislation, policies, and programs for social and economic benefit.

Program Administration

This program administers the use, disposition, and management of Crown resource lands by providing assistance in land use planning, land management, cottage lots, commercial recreation leases, and outfitters' licensing; and provides a focus in the department for the economic analysis of renewable resource policies including sustainable development strategies, as well as for legislation, Cabinet items, and federal-provincial agreements.

Wildlife (Subvote 6)

Objective

To develop, manage and evaluate policies and programs to sustain wildlife resources and to maximize recreational opportunity and economic benefits for all residents.

Program Administration

This program manages the Province's wildlife to ensure a sustainable supply and to provide maximum opportunity for Saskatchewan residents to enjoy wildlife-based recreation. Programs are aimed at wildlife conservation, habitat protection and enhancement, prevention of waterfowl and big game damage, wildlife damage prevention, public education including the proper use of firearms, wildlife monitoring including endangered species, and regulation of hunting within the Province.

Fisheries (Subvote 34)

Objective

To develop, manage, and evaluate policies and programs that protect, manage, and enhance the fishery resource of the Province.

Program Administration

This program develops, evaluates, and in some cases delivers, policies and programs that protect, manage, and enhance the fisheries resource of the Province. Programs are aimed at maintaining sustainable supplies of fish, habitat restoration, fish harvest allocation, researching fish management, improvements in the economic performance of the fisheries, and public education.

Forestry (Subvote 4)

Objective

To develop, implement, and administer provincial forest policy and programs which provide for a sustainable forest resource and encourage development opportunities with significant social and economic benefits.

Program Administration

This program develops and implements provincial forest policy and programs which provide for sound resource management and encourage development opportunities with significant social and economic benefits. Programs are aimed at managing provincial timber in both the short and long term, reducing effects of natural forces that degradate forests, encouraging economic opportunities using forest products, and public education.

Forest Fire Operations (Subvote 5)

Objective

To plan, coordinate, and deliver the administrative, technical, equipment, training, and operational requirements of the department's forest fire programs.

Program Administration

This program conducts public awareness and education programs about the dangers of fire thereby preventing forest fires. It also provides financial assistance for equipment, manpower, and fire fighting expertise, and coordinates the detection, pre-suppression, and suppression programs for fighting of forest fires in the Province.

Operations (Subvote 8)

Objective

To deliver park, forest, fish, wildlife, and resource lands programs to the public.

Program Administration

This program administers resource conservation, enforcement of resource regulations, management of parks and recreation areas, and assistance in forest fire suppression.

Contract Services (Subvote 41)

Objective

To provide professional and technical services regarding capital project management and program management of commercial leases in the park system.

Program Administration

This program provides support to the department and its programs through the supply of construction expertise, project management, and engineering services, and through the monitoring and development of contract administration and commercial leases.

Northern Air Services for Forest Fires (Subvote 3)

Objective

To assist in the suppression element of the department's forest fire operations.

Program Administration

This program provides assistance in the department's fire suppression program through the use of aircraft for fighting of forest fires in the Province.

Wildlife Landowner Assistance

(Subvote 14)

Objective

To prevent damage caused by big game to farm land.

Program Administration

This program assists farmers facing problems with deer damaging property by supplying fencing, bloodmeal, chemical repellents, scare pistols, or by providing game with an alternative food source.

Reforestation (Subvote 7)

Objective

To provide funding for the renewal of harvested forest lands.

Program Administration

This program provides support for government and industrial reforestation projects by growing seedlings and planting trees in areas harvested by small independent harvesters within the northern provincial forest.

Park Facilities and Resource Development (Capital) (Subvote 59)

Objective

To maintain and upgrade department facilities, including the provincial park system, that do not fall under Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation management.

Program Administration

This program, administered by Contract Services Branch, provides maintenance on existing department structures and delivers minor capital projects.

To provide for a net expenditure (recovery) of (from) the Resource Protection and Development Revolving Fund (Statutory) (Subvote 38)

Objective

To administer heavy equipment, radio communications, and staff housing programs in the department.

Program Administration

The Resource Protection and Development Revolving Fund provides equipment for maintenance and capital projects within the Province's parks, provides radio communications services in the north, and administers the staff housing program. Revenues earned are retained to cover associated costs. The net cash expenditure (recovery) for a fiscal year is a charge to the Consolidated Fund.

To provide an operating subsidy to the Commercial Revolving Fund (Subvote 46)

Obiective

To provide financial assistance in operating the provincial park system.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance for maintenance of parks in the Province. Revenues earned are retained to cover associated costs. This subvote provides a subsidy for the net difference between revenues generated and expenditures incurred in operating the provincial parks.

To provide for a net expenditure (recovery) of (from) the Commercial Revolving Fund (Statutory) (Subvote 37)

Objective

To administer the revenues and expenditures from operating the parks in the Province.

Program Administration

The Commercial Revolving Fund collects park revenues and covers related park expenditures with revenue collected. The net cash expenditure (recovery) for a fiscal year is a charge to the Consolidated Fund.

Fish and Wildlife Development Fund (Subvote 20)

Objective

To maintain and enhance the fish and wildlife within the Province.

Program Administration

This program supports the maintenance and enhancement of fish and wildlife resources in the Province through the use of thirty percent of revenue generated from the sale of hunting and angling licenses.

Grants to Regional Parks (Subvote 30)

Objective

To provide funds for the maintenance of a comprehensive regional park system which ensures all residents are within a reasonable distance to outdoor recreational opportunities.

Program Administration

This program monitors and provides financial assistance to parks to ensure they are properly maintained and developed where necessary.

Grants to agencies and organizations concerned with resource conservation, safety and promotional activities (Subvote 32)

Objective

To provide financial assistance to organizations which deal with the public on issues regarding conservation, safety, and promotion of resource conservation.

Program Administration

This program administers grants issued to various organizations.

Provincial Secretary (Vote 30)

The Department's mandate is to coordinate and manage intergovernmental relations, protocol services, communications policy, and print procurement; and to provide French language services. The Department is also responsible for the Office of the Lieutenant Governor; provides grant funding to Wascana Centre Authority; and is responsible for the maintenance of the Legislative Building.

Administration (Subvote 2)

Objective

To provide administrative services to the department.

Program Administration

This program provides executive direction, leadership and central administration, financial management, human resource management, and central computer services to the department.

Communications Policy and Planning (Subvote 3)

Objective

To provide centralized services to the government respecting all activities related to communications, advertising and printing functions.

Program Administration

This program develops and implements government wide policies on all communications, print procurement, advertising, and other related communications and printing functions. This office is also responsible for the government's Visual Identity Program.

Protocol Office (Subvote 4)

Objective

To facilitate state ceremonial functions and to support Saskatchewan's trade interests and links with other governments.

Program Administration

This office plans, organizes, and supervises visits of foreign diplomats, heads of state, ministers, and delegations. It also provides protocol consulting services to government agencies and the general public, and administers honours programs such as the Saskatchewan Order of Merit.

Expenses of the Office of the Lieutenant Governor (Subvote 6)

Objective

To represent Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in Saskatchewan

Program Administration

This office provides administrative services to the Queen's representative in Saskatchewan; arranges hospitality events, ceremonial and constitutional functions of the vice-regal; and provides liaison with the Government. It also provides the Province's anniversary messages.

Payments to Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation (Subvote 7)

Objective

To provide for certain payments to the Corporation.

Program Administration

This program provides for all payments to the Corporation respecting office accommodation, mail and photo services, records management, and capital projects. In addition, maintenance costs related to the Legislative Building are included within this program.

Office of French Language Co-ordination (Subvote 11)

Objective

To provide French language services and support to government departments and agencies.

Program Administration

This office assists and coordinates provincial initiatives in the area of French language services; provides linguistic support; and a translation service to government departments. It also provides services and liaises with the francophone community of the Province.

Payment to the Wascana Centre Authority for maintenance of grounds (Subvote 12)

Objective

To provide grant funding to the Authority for maintenance of grounds of the Centre.

Program Administration

The Authority provides for the maintenance of roads, sidewalks, and other infrastructure, including landscaping for the Legislative Building and other provincially owned land within Wascana Centre.

Public Service Commission (Vote 33)

The Public Service Commission is the central human resource agency for executive government in accordance with *The Public Service Act*.

Administrative and Information Services (Subvote 1)

Objective

To provide executive direction, and administrative, financial, and human resource support, communications support and information technology services to the Commission and throughout government.

Program Administration

This program provides maintenance and support services for the government wide Human Resource System and Personnel Attendance and Leave System. It acts as a central registry for government-wide personnel, position and competition records and provides the Commission with administrative, communications, information technology, and financial management services.

Employee Relations (Subvote 3)

Objective

To represent management effectively in employee relations.

Program Administration

This program provides comprehensive labour relations, compensation research, and administration services to the Government. It also negotiates two collective agreements covering all unionized employees in the Public Service and provides similar services to those agencies of government that are responsible for appointing their own employees, but do not have a collective bargaining service.

Staff Development (Subvote 11)

Objective

To empower employees through learning.

Program Administration

This program enhances job performance of employees, by providing learning opportunities through seminars, development programs, and conferences for both managers and employees. It also provides consulting services for work teams in government departments in the following areas: team building, service management, strategic planning, operational planning, and organizational development including mission statement definition.

Employment Services (Subvote 12)

Objective

To recruit and select the best job candidates for the public service.

Program Administration

This program manages the recruitment, selection and provision of human resource functions for the public service. It also provides professional employment services to government departments, agencies, and the public through its branches in Regina and Saskatoon.

Classification (Subvote 13)

Objective

To determine job worth by developing and applying classification standards to ensure equitable treatment of public service employees.

Program Administration

This program provides classification of permanent and nonpermanent positions; administration and resolution of classification appeals and challenges; documentation of senior level organization structures; audit of labour service classification and standards to aid recruitment and retention of appropriately qualified staff.

Student Employment Programs (Subvote 15)

Objective

To hire students for essential services and programs within the Government of Saskatchewan.

Program Administration

This program administers student applications and enters pertinent information into a computerized inventory system. Government organizations fill out requests for students based on the skills and abilities or areas of study preferred. The computer system matches the needs of the organizations to the current student inventory. This system ensures a random selection of students.

Rural Development (Vote 43)

The Department's mandate is to build together for a strong and prosperous rural community.

Administration (Subvote 1)

Objective

To provide for the operation of the Minister's, Deputy Minister's, and rural executive offices and to support rural development through financial, administrative, and information systems.

Program Administration

This program provides comprehensive financial and administrative services which support the effective and efficient management of the department and its resources; coordinates and provides services in budget preparation, procurement, accounts payable, mail, space accommodation, Central Vehicle Agency vehicles, forms, and telecommunications; and manages and delivers computer technology to the department.

Transportation Planning (Subvote 6)

Objective

To provide transportation planning services to rural municipalities, specific urban centres, and Indian Reserves for roads designated for provincial assistance.

Program Administration

This program designates roads eligible for provincial assistance and coordinates road planning in municipalities, urban municipalities with urban connectors, and Indian Reserves; and researches transportation issues and policies. It also provides administration of unconditional revenue sharing grants to rural municipalities and organized hamlets. It also provides research, technical, and financial assistance to improve traffic safety on municipal roads; develops road programs and policies including assistance rates; conducts road inventory and traffic count programs; and provides drafting and cartographic services including the distribution of municipal maps to the public.

Municipal Services (Subvote 28)

Objective

To enhance the role and autonomy of rural municipalities through provision of ongoing professional advisory and planning services and to assist the public and private sectors with the subdivision process.

Program Administration

This program supports and enhances the development of rural Saskatchewan by monitoring rural municipal programs to ensure fiscal standards are achieved; prepares related legislative documents; provides municipal officials and the public with interpretation, resolution, and mediation services; and assists municipalities with preparation of comprehensive planning documents. The program also administers the subdivision process; empowers municipal government and public through workshops; and facilitates inter-municipal cooperation and inter-departmental initiatives which achieve a strong and sustainable rural Saskatchewan.

Road Services (Subvote 10)

Objective

To provide technical and financial assistance to rural municipalities for the construction, reconstruction, oil surfacing, and maintenance of the designated road network.

Program Administration

This program provides technical and financial assistance to rural municipalities for designated roads, including: primary grid surfacing, primary grid gravel, grid, main farm access, special gravel, and special surfaced roads.

Bridge Services (Subvote 12)

Objective

To assist rural municipalities in the construction and maintenance of bridge and culvert structures on the provincial municipal road network.

Program Administration

This program provides bridge engineering services and financial assistance to the individual Rural Municipal councils for the construction and maintenance of river crossings on the municipal roads. Engineering services include: site inspections, recommendations of repair/replacement/load limits for existing structures, engineering design of new structures, and all arrangements for repair or construction.

Ferry Services (Subvote 2)

Objective

To provide efficient, free, seasonal transportation across rivers to rural residents, farmers, and local businesses.

Program Administration

This program operates and maintains cable ferries situated along the Saskatchewan River system.

Rural Community Development

(Subvote 18)

Objective

To assist rural Saskatchewan municipalities to establish and maintain effective community development groups, to achieve job creation, diversification, development, and enhanced viability.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance and professional services to community development organizations which enable communities to establish and maintain local employment opportunities through diversification and development programs.

Lands (Subvote 23)

Objective

To administer Crown agricultural land through leasing and community pasture operations; to ensure best land use; and to enhance the viability of farming operations.

Program Administration

This program administers approximately nine million acres of Crown lands that are classified for best use and sold or leased to farmers and ranchers. It also operates provincial community pastures which provide livestock producers with access to pasture land for a fee; and administers surface leases for petroleum, gas, and oil activities, special projects, and extension activities in land use and forage management.

Rural Service Network (Subvote 27)

Objective

To provide administrative support to government agencies of the Rural Service Network and to provide information to the general public.

Program Administration

This program provides administrative support to government departments and agencies such as Saskatchewan Crop Insurance Corporation and Agricultural Credit Corporation. Rural Service Centres are located throughout Saskatchewan and serve as the primary contact for rural residents requiring information on government programs, particularly those relating to rural development and agriculture.

Rural Information Services (Subvote 15)

Objective

To coordinate and communicate programs, policies, information, and accomplishments of the department to the public.

Program Administration

This program is responsible for coordinating the department's external and internal communications including an inquiry line, publications, press releases, advertising, and special events; and offers specialized support and advisory services in areas of production techniques and management, media relations, writing, graphics and artwork, and other related areas.

Community Pasture Development (Capital) (Subvote 29)

Objective

To provide capital facilities for community pasture operations.

Program Administration

This program develops Crown owned pasture land in the following areas: additional water development, additional fencing to enhance forage management, and major renovation of ageing facilities. Livestock producers put livestock in Crown operated pastures on a fee-for-service basis.

Grants for rural development (Subvote 3)

Obiective

To enable rural municipalities to provide a reasonable level of service in support of agricultural and economic development.

Program Administration

This program provides technical and financial assistance to rural municipalities to assist in the construction, surfacing, and maintenance of the designated municipal road network.

Assistance to general agricultural interests or purposes (Subvote 24)

Objective

To enable intermunicipal and other groups to provide agricultural, developmental, and diversification programs which include pest control.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to rural municipalities and other groups to communicate and coordinate information and programs relevant to the agricultural, developmental, and diversification opportunities. It also provides financial assistance to boards for pest control and industry development.

Rural Economic Development and Planning Grants (Subvote 31)

Objective

To enable rural municipalities to undertake community planning.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to rural municipalities to prepare municipal development plans and zoning bylaws in order to improve land use, municipal servicing, subdivision and environmental management, social and economic development, job creation, and diversification.

Grants in lieu of taxes on Crown lands (Subvote 26)

Objective

To maintain the tax base of rural municipalities where unallocated Crown land exists in the municipality and for community pasture land.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to rural municipalities in lieu of payment to the municipality on Crown land, such as community pasture land, permits, and vacant land.

Grants for agricultural lessees' share of compensation and rental payments for easements and surface leases

(Subvote 33)

Objective

To compensate farmers who lease Crown land which suffers detrimental effects as a result of easement activity.

Program Administration

This program provides financial compensation to farmers when easements cross their Crown lease land.

Saskatchewan Crop Insurance Corporation (Vote 46)

The Corporation's mandate is to provide Saskatchewan farm producers with insurance on crop production and commodity prices.

Payment to the Saskatchewan Crop Insurance Corporation — Net Operating Grant (Subvote 1)

Objective

To provide for the operating expenses associated with offering Saskatchewan farm producers crop production and commodity price insurance, as provided for under the Canada-Saskatchewan Crop Insurance Agreement and the Gross Revenue Insurance Program (GRIP).

Program Administration

This program provides an insurance program for the Saskatchewan farming community for crop loss due to natural causes and protection from low market prices. This includes gathering and compiling crop yields, insurance coverages and premiums, calculating individual yield-loss and revenue shortfall, and maintaining contact with the federal government and provincial government.

Payment to the Saskatchewan Crop Insurance Corporation for financing costs (Subvote 4)

Objective

To provide for interest costs on short-term and long-term debt requirements of the Saskatchewan Crop Insurance Program.

Program Administration

This program provides debt costs for the Provincial Crop Reinsurance Fund and the Saskatchewan Crop Insurance Program interim cash requirements.

Payment to the Saskatchewan Crop Insurance Corporation for provincial share of crop insurance premiums (Subvote 5)

Objective

To provide the provincial share of crop insurance premiums in accordance with the Canada-Saskatchewan Crop Insurance Agreement, which provides Saskatchewan producers with a comprehensive insurance for crop loss due to natural causes.

Program Administration

This program provides the Saskatchewan Crop Insurance Fund with the provincial government's portion, which is 25% of the total crop insurance premium.

Payment to the Canada-Saskatchewan Waterfowl Crop Damage Compensation Program Fund (Subvote 2)

Objective

To compensate Saskatchewan farmers for loss due to damage to unharvested crops caused by migratory waterfowl. Program Administration

Saskatchewan farmers suffering crop loss due to migratory waterfowl are eligible to apply for compensation. The Corporation adjusts the claims and authorizes payments within the criteria established in the Canada-Saskatchewan Crop Insurance Agreement.

Saskatchewan Municipal Board (Subvote 1)

Objective

To provide for the administrative activities and functions of the agency and its working committees.

Program Administration

This program provides administration and delivery of services. It also provides consultations in debt issues and utility rates, and financial advice to urban and rural municipalities, school divisions and union hospitals; and reviews applications for alteration of boundaries when affected municipalities cannot reach an agreement.

The Board of Revenue Commissioners is an administrative tribunal which hears appeals concerning monies claimed to be due and payable to the Crown.

Planning Appeals Committee (Subvote 2)

Objective

To hear and determine appeals on matters of municipal planning and development.

Program Administration

This program conducts appeals, throughout the Province, arising from disputed local decisions regarding municipal planning and development. Parties to the appeal are given an opportunity to present evidence and arguments; and written decisions are delivered by the Committee.

Assessment Appeals Committee (Subvote 3)

Objective

To hear and determine assessment appeals.

Program Administration

This program considers appeals, throughout the Province, arising from the local court of revision, which includes appeals regarding local improvement tax special assessments; and adjudicates on the apportionment of school levies when requested by the Minister of Education. Parties to the appeal are given an opportunity to present evidence and arguments, and written decisions are delivered by the Committee.

Program Administration

Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation provides a centralized purchasing program on behalf of all Government departments, agencies and commissions. This includes the tendering for purchases and the issuance of purchase orders. It also delivers the statutory requirements related to the survey, mapping and land database systems and provides assurances of appropriate visual presentation of Government. It tenders and acquires required capital assets for the use of Government.

Grant to the Saskatchewan Research Council (Subvote 1)

Objective

To apply science and technology for the economic development of Saskatchewan.

Program Administration

This program is accomplished through expertise, capabilities, and facilities of Saskatchewan Research Council working with sectors in the provincial economy, by identifying, developing, adapting, demonstrating, and transferring diversified scientific and technological solutions, applications and services to our over 2,000 clients each year (about 1,700 are small and medium size businesses).

Grant Payments

Saskatchewan Water Corporation (Vote 50)

Payment to the Saskatchewan Water Corporation — Net Operating Grant (Subvote 1)

Obiective

To manage, administer, develop, control, and protect the water and related land resources of Saskatchewan.

Program Administration

Major activities of the Saskatchewan Water Corporation include operation of major provincial river systems and reservoirs, regulation of water allocations, development of basin framework plans, administration of water-related complaints, provision of water-related information and communication, technical and engineering support to municipal water utilities and technical, engineering, design, construction, and administrative support for water-based economic development projects.

Payment to the Saskatchewan Water Corporation for flood control and drainage programs (Capital) (Subvote 2)

Obiective

To develop and construct orderly solutions to water control problems with emphasis on multi-use projects.

Program Administration

This program provides administrative, engineering, and project management support to local government organizations to solve rural and urban water control problems within the context of basin framework plans. Emphasis is to cost-effectively reduce flooding of productive farm land and reduce flood damage in rural and urban areas. Multi-use projects which also support urban water supply, irrigation, wildlife habitat development or sewage effluent disposal are encouraged.

Payment to the Saskatchewan Water Corporation for irrigation programs (Subvote 7)

Objective

To support water-based economic development activity.

Program Administration

This is done through agronomic, engineering, and other technical support for irrigators and irrigation-based research and development. Research and development includes funding for the Saskatchewan Irrigation Development Centre. Much of this activity is cost shared with Agriculture Canada.

Payment to the Saskatchewan Water Corporation for irrigation development (Capital) (Subvote 8)

Obiective

To create water-based economic development activity.

Program Administration

The program has three major components: 1) maintenance and rehabilitation of existing irrigation work; 2) development and construction of major and group irrigation projects; and, 3) development and construction of individual projects. This is accomplished by cost-sharing construction of such projects with individual and group irrigators.

Payment to the Saskatchewan Water Corporation for grants for irrigation development (Subvote 9)

Objective

To promote efficient irrigation development on Saskatchewan farms.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance for the development of on-farm irrigation projects.

Seniors' Secretariat (Vote 42)

Seniors' Secretariat (Subvote 1)

Objective

To serve as a central coordinator in Government for seniors' issues.

Program Administration

The Secretariat acts as a contact for seniors with the Government. It develops, coordinates, promotes, and implements policies and programs related to seniors and provides staff support to the Senior Citizens' Provincial Council.

Grants for Senior Citizens' Services (Subvote 3)

Objective

To provide operating grants to cover a broad range of activities for the benefit of seniors in the community.

Program Administration

This program provides senior activity centres and two provincial seniors' organizations with assistance for the ongoing administrative and maintenance costs of buildings and programs. To qualify for a grant, a seniors' group must be incorporated as a non-profit corporation or cooperative and must meet grant eligibility criteria established by the Seniors' Secretariat.

Grants pursuant to The Senior Citizens' Heritage Program Act (Statutory) (Subvote 6)

Objective

To provide unconditional grants to low and middle income seniors.

Program Administration

This program provides an annual grant to seniors age 65 or older. Senior households with combined total incomes of \$22,000 or less qualify for a \$500 grant. Seniors residing in public housing or in nursing homes do not qualify for the Heritage grant. This program sunsets December 31, 1992.

Saskatchewan Income Plan — Senior Citizens' Benefits (Subvote 4)

Objective

To provide financial benefits to seniors who have little or no income other than the federal Old Age Security Pension and Guaranteed Income Supplement.

Program Administration

This program pays monthly benefits to seniors who are 65 years of age or older. No application is required to receive payments. Benefits are determined by marital status, place of residence, and the amount of guaranteed income supplement a pensioner receives.

This program provides executive management and other support services including the negotiation and administration of federal-provincial cost sharing agreements; assistance in the review, evaluation, and development of departmental legislation, policies, and programs; human resource management and staff development services; the provision of budget and financial management services; computer systems development and maintenance; communications; and a variety of administrative and support services to the province-wide network of regional offices and facilities.

Income Security (Subvote 29)

Payments to New Careers Corporation for Training and Employment of Social Assistance Recipients (Subvote 58)

Saskatchewan Assistance Plan (Subvote 4)

Family Income Plan (Subvote 28)

Objective

To provide financial assistance, and support services to people in need.

Program Administration

This program provides financial assistance to people in need because of disability, ill health, low income, or unemployment. In partnership with the New Careers Corporation, it also provides training and employment opportunities for persons receiving benefits under the Saskatchewan Assistance Plan.

Child Care (Subvote 51)

Grants for Child Care (Subvote 18)

Allowances for Child Care (Subvote 41)

Objective

To regulate child care facilities and assist low income families access child care services.

Program Administration

This program licenses child (day) care and family child care homes; monitors and provides support to all licensed facilities; administers the Child Care Subsidy Program which provides financial assistance to help low income families pay child care costs. It also administers various grants to centres and homes to assist with start-up and operational costs.

Community Living (Subvote 24)

Payments and Grants for Community Living (Subvote 27)

Objective

To provide and facilitate community-based support services that assist people with mental or physical disabilities to live as independently as possible within their own communities.

Program Administration

This program provides support services to disabled persons, their families, and community-based organizations through: case management; assistance to agencies and parents in program planning for children and adults with mental disabilities; coordination of community resources; short and long-term residential care; and the operation of the Valley View Centre, Moose Jaw.

Family and Youth Services (Subvote 56)

Children's Services (Subvote 5)

Payments and Grants for Family and Youth Services (Subvote 23)

Obiective

To promote the well-being of children, youth, and families.

Program Administration

This program protects children from abuse and neglect, supports families and communities in caring for children, assists people facing family violence, and provides adoption services.

The program also delivers provincial programs and services under *The Young Offenders Act* (Canada) including the operation of secure and open custody facilities. Where appropriate, community-based programs and services are provided to youth as an alternative to custody.

Regional Operations (Subvote 7)

Objective

To deliver the Saskatchewan Assistance Plan and child, family and youth services.

Program Administration

This program directly delivers the Saskatchewan Assistance Plan and child, family and youth services through a province-wide network of regional offices. Services are delivered in partnership with non-government organizations and Aboriginal authorities.

Payments to Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation (Subvote 57)

Objective

To provide for payments to the Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation.

Program Administration

The Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation provides the department with office and institutional accommodation, mail and photo services, records management, and minor renovation services.

Payment to the Saskatchewan Legal Aid Commission (Subvote 53)

Objective

To provide legal services to individuals and non-profit organizations with insufficient financial resources to pay for legal services.

Program Administration

This program provides legal services to eligible applicants in most but not all criminal matters. Civil law services are generally restricted to family law.
